Prayer for our Government
by Archbishop John Carroll (1791)

We pray, O almighty and eternal God, who through Jesus Christ has revealed thy glory to all nations, to preserve the works of your mercy, that your Church, being spread through the whole world, may continue with unchanging faith in the confession of your name.

We pray Thee, who alone are good and holy, to endow with heavenly knowledge, sincere zeal and sanctity of life, our chief bishop, the pope, the vicar of Our Lord Jesus Christ, in the government of his Church; our own bishop, all other bishops, prelates and pastors of the Church; and especially those who are appointed to exercise among us the functions of the holy ministry, and conduct your people into the ways of salvation.

We pray O God of might, wisdom and justice, through whom authority is rightly administered, laws are enacted, and judgment decreed, assist with your Holy Spirit of counsel and fortitude the president of these United States, that his administration may be conducted in righteousness and be eminently useful to your people over whom he presides; by encouraging due respect for virtue and religion, by a faithful execution of the laws in justice and mercy; and by restraining vice and immorality.

Let the light of your divine wisdom direct the deliberations of Congress, and shine forth in all the proceedings and laws framed for our rule and government, so that they may tend to the preservation of peace, the promotion of national happiness, the increase of industry, sobriety and useful knowledge; and may perpetuate to us the blessing of equal liberty.

We pray for his excellency, the governor of this state, for the members of the assembly, for all judges, magistrates, and other officers who are appointed to guard our political welfare, that they may be enabled, by your powerful protection, to discharge the duties of their respective stations with honesty and ability.

We recommend likewise, to your unbounded mercy, all our brethren and fellow citizens throughout the United States, that they may be blessed in the knowledge and sanctified in the observance of your most holy law; that they may be preserved in union, and in that peace which the world cannot give; and after enjoying the blessings of this life, be admitted to those which are eternal.

Finally, we pray to you, O Lord of mercy, to remember the souls of your servants departed, who are gone before us with the sign of faith and repose in the sleep of peace; the souls of our parents, relatives and friends; of those who, when living, were members of this congregation, and particularly of such as are lately deceased; of all benefactors who, by their donations and legacies of this Church, witnessed their zeal for the decency of divine worship and proved their claim to our grateful and charitable remembrance. To these, O Lord and to all that rest in Christ, grant, we beseech you, a place of refreshment, light and everlasting peace, through the same Jesus Christ, Our Lord and Savior. Amen

"MOTHER CABRINI"

Dear Friends:

I have a special relationship with Mother Cabrini (Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini). We share the same birthday, July 15th!

Mother Cabrini was a major figure in American Catholicism in the late 1800's and the early 1900's. She came from Italy to New York City in 1889 along with six other sisters (1889 was the year my maternal grandmother was born in Denver). In New York City, Mother Cabrini worked with Italian immigrants, helping them with religious instruction and education.

Mother Cabrini founded hospitals in New York City and Chicago. She founded 67 missionary institutions to serve the sick and the poor in America, Latin America and Europe. She was a determined and unstoppable worker, traveling across the world at a time when travel was difficult.

In October of 2020, a new statue was unveiled of Mother Cabrini by Governor Cuomo in New York City. There was a slight controversy about the statue. A New York City Commission for building statues of New York City women who helped the city, decided there would not be a statue of Mother Cabrini, even though Mother Cabrini received the most votes in a public poll. Governor Cuomo intervened and proclaimed that the State of New York would build a statue.

I have a special relationship also with Mother Cabrini because she has a shrine in my hometown, Golden, Colorado. The shrine is on a beautiful spot in the foothills of western Denver. You can see the whole city from the top of the Shrine. Even before I was a Catholic, I remember seeing the shrine and asking my Mother about it. At the top of the hill where the shrine is located is a 22 foot high statue of Jesus with the Sacred Heart on His chest. Mother Cabrini's sisters are called the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Mother Cabrini was canonized in 1946, the first U.S. citizen to be canonized as a Saint.

However, throughout the history of the development of "Rights" in society, there were critics. These critics worried that an over-emphasis on "rights" would diminish the equal necessity of obligations and duties. It seems that this has happened to a degree. Rights are important. But, we can never forget that there are also obligations and duties in society. It isn't always important that we get what we want, but sometimes it's important to do things that we should.
