

Covid regulations

Confession will be held by the rectory garage in the parking lot (or the school gym on bad weather days) on Monday and Wednesday evenings from 6pm until 6:45pm. Please keep your distance from others and simply stand behind the screen for confession. Stay away from the confession station until it is your turn in order to maintain privacy.

Masses will begin the weekend of May 30-31 at the normal mass times (4:30pm Saturday, Sunday 8:30, 11:30am and 1pm Spanish)

If you are sick, DO NOT come to Mass.

If you are elderly, immunocompromised or have any underlying condition that would make Covid particularly dangerous to you, please stay home until things are safer. All Catholics have been dispensed by the Bishop from the need to go to Mass until Sept. 6.

Every other pew will be roped off. Please respect the ropes and do not use roped off pews.

There will be no altar servers, extraordinary ministers of Communion or ushers at this time.

Please wear a face mask unless you are medically unable to do so.

Maintain 6 foot distance from other people not of your own household both when in the pews and while walking about.

There will be no collection as we are used to. A box will be placed near each of the three doors which you can use when coming in or going out. You can also use online giving or postal mail.

There will be no sign of peace as we are used to, but simply make a nod or a smile or some such non-physical contact type thing.

Communion will be offered in the Host only. There will be two stations. One at the front and the other at the back of Church. One line will be formed beginning with one side and then moving to the other side. Please keep 6 foot distance from the person in front of you, unless they are of your household. If at all possible, please receive communion on the hand. If you receive on the tongue and my finger comes into contact with your lip or tongue I will have to sanitize my hands immediately. It doesn't happen often, but it does happen, so consider receiving on the hand. When receiving on the hand, please make sure your hands are one on top of the other and flat. Very often, people make an almost bowl-like shape with their hands and it becomes difficult not to touch your hand with my own. Flat hands, please.

When leaving church, please respect social distancing. Do not form groups until you are out in the open air, and even then, still following social distancing of at least 6 foot separation from those not of your household.

Two healthy people will be needed after each Mass to sanitize the pews and bathroom.
