What's So Special About Sunday?

Our Gospel today speaks about the call of the mountain, the call to union with God. The mountaintop experience was a stunning one for Peter, James and John. They had a glimpse of the glory and the truth about Jesus. There they heard the words of the Father, "Listen to Him."

The account of the Transfiguration begins with the phrase, "Six days later." For six days, they carried the news of Jesus' impending death. On the seventh day, Jesus took Peter, James and John up the mountain and there they saw the glory. Here, on this seventh day - on the mountain of the Christian Sabbath - we are given a chance to get the bigger picture, the deeper view.

Sunday is the Day of the Lord, a fundamental feast day. Sunday returns us to the true center of world history and of human life, the Lord's Resurrection. It is also a day to enjoy well-deserved rest and to enjoy family and friends in healthy, moral and Christian ways.

Sunday is the Day of Christ, when we hear the word of the Lord, apply it to our life and receive the Lord in the Eucharist. It is a time to recall that, in everything we do, we are called to be disciples of Jesus.

Sunday is the Day of the Church, when we are reminded that we are part of a community of faith, that our life is part of the Church's life and that the Church's life - her concerns, problems and successes - should be part of ours.

Let us resolve that weekly Mass attendance will be part of our lives. Here we come close to the Lord, hear His truth, experience His Eucharist, join our prayer to His sacrifice, grasp the big picture, renew our discipleship, profess in the Creed the non-negotiable truths that bind us together, come to know something of God's light, and convey something of that light to a dark world.

We are all called every week to the mountain of prayer at Sunday Mass. Here we learn to leave behind the false gods, as Abraham did in today's first reading. Here we can come to know the grace of a new and eternal life to which St. Paul refers. Here we receive something of Christ's power to guide us in difficult days, as Jesus says in the Gospel, "Rise, and do not be afraid."

Sunday Mass is one of the defining characteristics of our Catholic identity. Some say, "I don't have to go to church. I can pray to God in the forest." Of course, but we can do both. We experience at Mass the cleansing, renewing power of Christ through Word and Sacrament. We have the assured presence of Christ. We have more than a time of personal prayer - we join our prayer to the prayer of the Church.

Jesus has no need any more to be transfigured or changed. He is now in glory. The Lord doesn't need Sunday. We do.

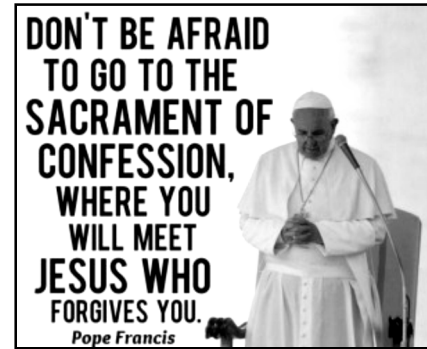

(EXCEPTION: The Poor Boxes are specially marked for Archdiocesan Special Collections about once a month.) While much of our Poor Box funds are channeled on a monthly basis through the Upper Montgomery County Assistance Network, Gaithersburg HELP and Germantown HELP, they also support advocacy organizations such as Action in Montgomery. We often work closely with the City of Gaithersburg's Community Services Program Manager in contributing to collections supported by many organizations to assist especially needy persons in the local community. Emergency assistance, usually for parish members, is also given from our Poor Box. This help is for such items as food and utility bills, especially for the unemployed; emergency travel expenses, gas, rental assistance, etc.

Especially during the Lenten season when we are challenged to embrace almsgiving, please consider making a gift to the Poor Box fund to help our brothers and sisters in need. After Masses, the Church Foyer can often be crowded, so placing your donation in the Poor Box as you arrive for Mass may be a bit easier.
