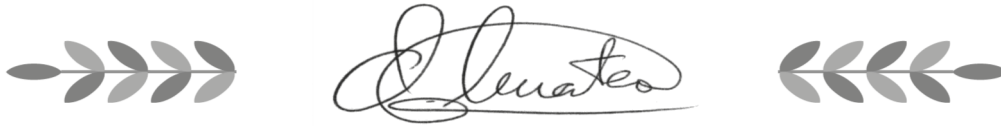

WORDS FROM OUR PASTOR / PALABRAS DE NUESTRO PASTOR



The tragedy and suffering we see in our world defies all human efforts at peace. We wonder where those servant leaders are, the humble people who will lead us on toward the kingdom and the promise of a better and greater life? They are here in our midst, because we know that God does not abandon His people.

Today, Jesus explains how "real leadership" is to be exercised. "Servant leaders" are neither like the Scribes nor the Pharisees who lay heavy burdens on the people and do not lift a finger to help them. He saw through "their narrow-minded legalism" and "self-importance". To be good leaders, they must practice what they preached. For the greatest among you, Jesus tells us, will be the one who serves the rest. It is the humble person who is exalted.

Whenever we begin to think that we are a little bit better than others, we can be sure that there is something wrong. The right practice of our faith always brings about a sense of humility because all that we have, and all that we are, and all that we will ever be comes from God, Who has first loved us and called us into being. All of us, young or old, rich or poor, saint or sinner, are children of a loving Father.

The pride that comes from the bad practice of religion is the most insidious because it becomes a way of life. The reasoning goes like this: Since I am right and you are wrong, since I am more religious than you, then God must be on my side. This means that God has chosen me to set you straight. This puts me in charge of things, even your very life.

That is exactly the attitude that brought about Jesus' death, the crusades, the inquisition, slavery, the suffering and death in Nazi Germany, and those places of violence we see in our troubled world today. It is the attitude expressed on some religious TV shows where the preachers think that God is on their side against others who don't believe like they do. It is the attitude of those who will not be reconciled with their families or friends. It is also the source of the division we see in our Church.

God is not on our side against anyone. We are all His people, the Body of Christ in our world today. All of our efforts as followers of the Lord of life is not to conquer or even control but to serve, to share our time and our talent bringing about the Kingdom. True greatness is found in serving others for that is the expression of love of God and love of neighbor. Love and compassion are always first. This is at the very heart and center of our faith. Do you believe that? Yes it is true; you and I are called to be the servant leaders in our troubled world.

La tragedia y sufrimiento que vemos en nuestro mundo desafía todos los esfuerzos humanos de paz. Nos preguntamos dónde están los líderes sirvientes, las personas humildes que nos conducirán hacia el Reino y la promesa de una vida mejor? Están aquí entre nosotros, porque sabemos que Dios no abandona a su pueblo.

Hoy, Jesús explica cómo el "verdadero liderazgo" debe ejercerse. "Líderes que son siervos," no como los escribas ni los fariseos que ponían pesadas cargas sobre las personas y no levantaban ni un dedo para ayudarlos. El Señor descubrió "su legalismo intolerante" y "prepotencia". Para ser un buen líder hay que practicar lo que predica. Es la persona humilde que es exaltada.

Cuando comenzamos a pensar que sólo somos mejores que alguna otra persona, o algún otro grupo o iglesia, podemos estar seguros de que hay algo mal. La práctica correcta de nuestra fe siempre trae consigo un sentido de humildad porque todo lo que tenemos, y todo lo que somos y todo lo que seremos proviene de Dios, que primero nos amó y nos llamó a ser. Todos nosotros, joven o viejo, rico o pobre, santo o los pecadores somos hijos de un Padre amoroso.

El orgullo que viene de la mala práctica de la religión es algo insidioso porque se vuelve una forma de vida. El razonamiento va así: ya que yo tengo razón y tú estás equivocado, ya que soy más religioso que tú, entonces Dios debe estar de mi lado. Esto significa que Dios me ha elegido para corregir a los demás. Esto me pone a cargo de las cosas, incluso tú propia vida.

Esa es exactamente la actitud que provocó la muerte de Jesús, las cruzadas, la Inquisición, la esclavitud, sufrimiento y muerte en la Alemania Nazi, y los lugares de la violencia que hoy vemos en nuestro atribulado mundo. Es la actitud expresada en algunos programas de televisión religiosos donde los predicadores piensan que Dios está de su lado contra otros que no creen como ellos. Es la misma actitud de aquellos que no se reconciliarán con sus familias o sus amigos. Es también la fuente de la división que vemos en nuestra iglesia.

Dios no está de nuestro lado o del de nadie. Somos todos su pueblo, el cuerpo de Cristo en nuestro mundo de hoy. Todos nuestros esfuerzos como seguidores del Señor de la vida no es conquistar o incluso control sino servir, para compartir nuestro tiempo y nuestro talento llevando a cabo el Reino. La auténtica grandeza se encuentra en el servicio porque servir es la expresión del amor a Dios y al prójimo. Amor y compasión siempre son primeros. Esto es en el centro de nuestra fe y corazón y tú y yo estamos llamados a ser líderes en nuestro mundo perturbado.

QUESTION:

In the Creed recited each week at Mass, why do we say "I believe" instead of "We believe"?

ANSWER:

When the new English translation of the Mass appeared a few years ago, many noticed the change in language in the Creed from "We believe" to "I believe" and many people were curious about why this change was made. At first glance, it seems to shift the character of the Mass from a communal worship of God to an individual act of worship. But something quite the contrary was at work.

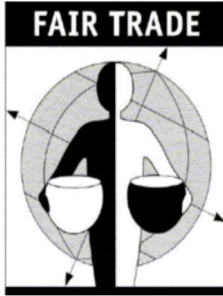
The prayers and text of the Mass are found in a book (seen on the altar at each Mass) called the "Roman Missal". It is basically the script for the Mass. The whole translation process begins with the Latin typical edition, which has changed very little since its inception after the Second Vatican Council. From the Latin edition, translations are made so that Mass can be said in the various local languages around the world. Interestingly, the English translation is of special importance: Some countries which lack experts in Latin have actually made their local translation using English as the base language.

Returning to the Creed, we see that the opening word in Latin is "Credo," which literally means, "I believe." Thus, the shift in language was an attempt to be as accurate as possible to the original. But, there is still something deeper at work.

When we say "We believe," the statement implies a collection of individuals speaking together about their shared belief. Certainly this is praiseworthy. But during Mass, when we say "I believe," we are speaking not as a collection of individuals, but as the Body of Christ. Thus, the singular actually implies an even greater unity, which is uniquely brought about by the Eucharist - the source of all unity.
