WORDS FROM OUR PASTOR / PALABRAS DE NUESTRO PASTOR







We often look for all kinds of shortcuts in life. We prefer to take the least demanding way to get something done. We seek pleasure and try with all of our might to avoid pain, suffering and sacrifice. Life demands "the very best" in us and God will always be there to see that we do just that.

Today, we hear how the Spirit sent Jesus out into the desert and He was greatly tested. A force drove Him there so that He might "experience humanity" in all of its weakness. Like you and me, Jesus was tempted to take the easy way out. He was tempted to think that He could manage His life on His own, reigning over an earthly kingdom rather than serving His Father's kingdom. He was tempted in every way that we experience discouragement, doubt and despair. Jesus knew temptation. He knows our human condition. As the scriptures so often remind us, He was human in all things but sin.

He also knew that His Father would be with Him in all circumstances. He knew His Father would be there to strengthen and encourage Him to make the right decisions, to help Him proclaim good news.

Often we think that we are weak when we are tempted, but it is the opposite. Our temptations come to strengthen us and give us an opportunity to do even greater things. Gold is always tested and purified in fire. If we are to be patient people, then we can expect to have many occasions to become impatient. Patience comes from the Latin word "patior" meaning to suffer and that is why they call people in the hospital "patients." There can be no virtue where there is no suffering.

If we are to be kind and loving in the things we say and do, then there will be many opportunities to be selfish, self-centered, and concerned only with our own needs, forgetting the suffering and pain of others. If we want to be humble people, we can expect others will test our pride, maybe by finding fault and expecting us to act like they do. There can be no growth in virtue unless we are given a choice, unless we are tested to do the opposite.

Many of our temptations deal with attitudes, discouragement, doubt, despair, depression, and our disregard for others and their feelings. Many times we prefer to give up trying to do good, to really work at becoming the beautiful person God has called us to be. The sad part is that we can become so comfortable with things as they are that we don't realize that things can be different, that our lives could be better.

Maybe that is why we have these forty days of Lent to recognize our need to make this world a better place for everyone. What a wonderful opportunity for all of us!

The Lord knows our weaknesses, doubts, and temptations to take the easy way out. Yet He still loves us. God is with us especially during Lent as we strive to live out His Good News.

Hoy, escuchamos cómo el Espíritu envió a Jesús al desierto y fue puesto a prueba en gran medida. Una fuerza lo condujo allí para que pudiera "experimentar a la humanidad" en toda su debilidad. Al igual que tú y yo, Jesús estuvo tentado de tomar el camino más fácil. Estuvo tentado a pensar que podía manejar Su vida por su cuenta, reinando sobre un reino terrenal en lugar de servir al reino de Su Padre. Fue tentado en todos los sentidos por lo que somos experimentamos el desaliento, la duda y la desesperación. Jesús conocía la tentación. Él conoce nuestra condición humana. Como las escrituras tan a menudo nos recuerdan, Él era humano en todo excepto en el pecado.

También sabía que su Padre estaría con Él en todas las circunstancias. Sabía que su Padre estaría allí para fortalecerlo y alentarlo a tomar las decisiones correctas, para ayudarlo a proclamar buenas nuevas.

A menudo pensamos que somos débiles cuando somos tentados, pero es lo opuesto. Nuestras tentaciones vienen a fortalecernos y darnos la oportunidad de hacer cosas aún mayores. El oro siempre se prueba y se purifica en fuego. Si queremos ser personas pacientes, podemos esperar muchas ocasiones para impacientarnos. La paciencia proviene de una palabra latina "patior" que significa sufrir y es por eso que llaman a las personas en el hospital "pacientes". No puede haber virtud donde no hay sufrimiento.

Si queremos ser amables y afectuosos en las cosas que decimos y hacemos, habrá muchas oportunidades para ser egoístas, egocéntricos y preocupados solo por nuestras propias necesidades, olvidando el sufrimiento y el dolor de los demás. Si queremos ser personas humildes, podemos esperar que otros pongan a prueba nuestro orgullo, tal vez encontrando fallas y esperando que actuemos como lo hacen. No puede haber crecimiento en la virtud a menos que se nos dé una opción, a menos que seamos probados para hacer lo opuesto.

Muchas de nuestras tentaciones se relacionan con las actitudes, el desaliento, la duda, la desesperación, la depresión, y nuestra indiferencia hacia los demás y sus sentimientos. Muchas veces preferimos dejar de intentar hacer el bien, realmente trabajar para convertirnos en la persona bella que Dios nos ha llamado a ser. La parte triste es que podemos estar tan cómodos con las cosas como lo están, que no nos damos cuenta de que las cosas pueden ser diferentes, que nuestras vidas podrían ser mejores.

Quizás es por eso que tenemos estos cuarenta días de Cuaresma para reconocer nuestra necesidad de hacer de este mundo un lugar mejor para todos. ¡Que maravillosa oportunidad para todos nosotros!

El Señor conoce nuestras debilidades, dudas, y tentaciones de tomar el camino más fácil. Sin embargo, Él todavía nos ama. Dios está con nosotros especialmente durante la Cuaresma mientras nos esforzamos por vivir Sus Buenas Nuevas.

QUESTION: Why are purple vestments and altar scarves used at Mass during Lent?

ANSWER: Astute observers often make note of the fact that the colors at Mass often change throughout the year. The liturgical colors are part of the rich symbolism of the Mass, which serves to draw us more deeply into the events that we celebrate. Green is the calming color of ordinary time; white, the joyful color of the great feasts; and red, the intense color of the martyrs and the Holy Spirit. But why do we use purple (or violet, as it is technically called) during Lent and Advent?

Lent and Advent are both seasons of preparation before the two principle liturgical feasts of the year, Easter and Christmas. It is not an accident that both explosively joyful feasts are preceded by a somber period of penance. Like the dramatic *chiaroscuro* effect in Caravaggio's paintings, the experience of mourning and penance that precedes joy is a constant feature in the Christian life. The greatest gift that God has ever given us is the gift of his son, Jesus Christ, who offers the possibility of being healed of the wounds that sin has left in our lives. The healing that Jesus offers is not merely superficial, but involves deep transformation. As the year winds around the liturgical cycle, we are given two seasons in which we have the opportunity to look at our lives and invite Jesus anew into some area in need of healing. That is the principle focus of Advent and Lent.

But why is purple the color of the season? If we turn our attention to our Lord's passion (Mk 15:17-20; Jn 19:2-3), we see that, shortly before his death, Jesus was clothed in a purple cloak. Purple (specifically Tyrian purple) was a color associated with royalty in the ancient world. The act of clothing Christ in purple was, consequently, a gesture mocking his claim to royalty – a claim later vindicated in his resurrection. The use of purple as a penitential color, therefore, recalls the divine paradox: that through humility and sacrifice we find healing that produces a lasting joy.
