WORDS FROM OUR PASTOR / PALABRAS DE NUESTRO PASTOR

Life is filled with all kinds of challenges, changes and surprises. We wonder what is going to happen next. We prepare our agenda, set forth our plans, mark our calendars and hopefully wait for things to go our way. But life is filled with surprises, unexpected events, joys and sorrows that color our days and change our lives. Life is a mystery! Many of our greatest hopes and dreams never become real, but thank God, most of our worries and fears never do either. God has a plan for each of us and it is filled with all kinds of unexpected events.

Those who followed the Lord and remembered Him in the breaking of the bread wondered what to expect next. Where would they go? How would they ever pick up the pieces of their lives and start over again? Suddenly Jesus walked into their lives, quietly and calmly, just as though nothing out of the ordinary had happened. "Peace be with you," He said. They could not believe their eyes. They certainly did not expect Him. "Don't be anxious or disturbed. Look at my hands and my feet. It is really I. Do you have something to eat?"

After eating with them, He began to open their minds and hearts to understand the scriptures. "Didn't you realize that the Messiah must suffer? Don't you understand that He would be put to death and then on the third day rise from the dead?" Little by little, they were able to look beyond their suffering, their loss and failure, even beyond the death of the Lord to find a new life, a new beginning, a Resurrection. Now they knew what was expected of them. They had come to a turning point in their lives, a point from which there would be no turning back. They knew the Risen Lord in their midst and now they would be witnesses, signs of His presence in the world. They would be believers - but also doers - of the words they had heard. They were transformed into a whole new way of seeing life.

As we celebrate these Easter mysteries, we, too, are to be witnesses of what we believe. If people are to believe in the Resurrection of Jesus, they must see it in our lives. We begin this good work by reminding ourselves that we are loved, that we are a forgiven people and that loving forgiveness is to be shared with all those who have hurt us or have rejected or failed to love us.

This forgiveness must begin in our homes, our places of work, our neighborhoods, and our Church. We are to be God's unexpected love in the lives of others by our care, concern, willingness to forgive and forget, and serving their needs.

On that Easter evening, the Lord of Life brought His peace to His disciples. He calmed all their fears and they knew His forgiveness. He ate with them and opened their minds and hearts to receive His love. In this Eucharistic celebration, the Risen Lord is also in our midst as we gather in His name. We share in the one bread and drink the one cup of salvation, making ourselves one in His love. We experience His peace and then we go out to bring that peace, forgiveness and love to others. We are witnesses of what we believe.

Pero la vida está llena de sorpresas, eventos inesperados, alegrías y tristezas que colorean nuestros días y cambian nuestras vidas. ¡La vida es un misterio! Muchas de nuestras esperanzas y sueños más grandes nunca se vuelven reales, pero gracias a Dios, la mayoría de nuestras preocupaciones y miedos nunca lo hacen. Dios tiene un plan para cada uno de nosotros y está lleno de todo tipo de eventos inesperados.

Los que siguieron al Señor y lo recordaron al partir el pan se preguntaron qué esperar a continuación. ¿A dónde irían? ¿Cómo podrían retomar los pedazos de sus vidas y empezar de nuevo? De repente, Jesús entró en sus vidas, silenciosa y tranquilamente, como si nada fuera de lo común hubiera sucedido. "La paz sea contigo", dijo. No podían creer lo que veían. Ciertamente no lo esperaban. "No estés ansioso o perturbado. Mira mis manos y mis pies. Soy yo. ¿Tienes algo para comer?"

Después de comer con ellos, comenzó a abrir sus mentes y corazones para comprender las Escrituras. "¿No te diste cuenta de que el Mesías debe sufrir? ¿No entiendes que Él sería ejecutado y al tercer día resucitaría de entre los muertos?" Poco a poco, pudieron ver más allá de su sufrimiento, su pérdida y su fracaso, incluso más allá de la muerte del Señor, para encontrar una nueva vida, un nuevo comienzo, una Resurrección. Ahora sabían lo que se esperaba de ellos. Habían llegado a un punto de inflexión en sus vidas, un punto del que no habría vuelta atrás. Ellos conocían al Señor Resucitado en medio de ellos y ahora serían testigos, señales de Su presencia en el mundo. Serían creyentes pero también hacedores de las palabras que habían escuchado. Se transformaron en una forma completamente nueva de ver la vida.

Al celebrar estos misterios de Pascua, nosotros también debemos ser testigos de lo que creemos. Si las personas han de creer en la Resurrección de Jesús, deben verla en nuestras vidas. Comenzamos este buen trabajo recordándonos a nosotros mismos que somos amados, que somos personas perdonadas y que el perdón amoroso debe compartirse con todos aquellos que nos han lastimado o han rechazado o han dejado de amarnos.

Este perdón debe comenzar en nuestros hogares, nuestros lugares de trabajo, nuestros vecindarios y nuestra Iglesia. Debemos ser el amor inesperado de Dios en las vidas de los demás por nuestro cuidado, preocupación, voluntad de perdonar y olvidar, servir a sus necesidades.

En esa tarde de Pascua, el Señor de la Vida trajo Su paz a Sus discípulos. Él calmó todos sus miedos y ellos conocieron su perdón. Él comió con ellos y abrió sus mentes y corazones para recibir su amor. En esta celebración eucarística, el Señor Resucitado también está en medio de nosotros mientras nos reunimos en Su nombre. Compartimos en un solo pan y bebemos la única copa de la salvación, haciéndonos uno en Su amor. Experimentamos Su paz y luego salimos para llevar esa paz, perdón y amor a otros. Debemos ser testigos de lo que creemos.

WHAT IS AN APOSTOLIC EXHORTATION?

An apostolic exhortation is a letter to the Church which is a part of the Pope's teaching office. Pope Francis has recently written the Apostolic Exhortation *Gaudete et Exsultate* (Rejoice and Be Glad) on the Call to Holiness in Today's World. In 2016, he wrote *Amoris Laetitia*, which is a post-synodal apostolic exhortation because it follows the Synods on the Family, taking up the themes of the Synods and deepening them further. Pope Francis writes: "I thought it appropriate to prepare a post-synodal Apostolic Exhortation to gather the contributions of the two recent Synods on the family, while adding other considerations as an aid to reflection, dialogue and pastoral practice, and as a help and encouragement to families in their daily commitments and challenges." Cardinal Wuerl has developed a Pastoral Plan to implement *Amoris Laetitia*, which is being handed out today.

QUESTION: What does it mean to pray?

ANSWER: In these Easter days, we feel the keen desire of the disciples that the Lord remain with them (Luke 24:29), a desire ultimately fulfilled in our prayer. It seems like prayer should be easy, but we may need to *learn* how to pray (Luke 11: 1-13). Or rather, we may need to *unlearn* what we mistakenly think is the way to pray.

At the heart of prayer is the fact that our relationship with God is echoed in our relationships with the people in our lives – our friends and family. At the most basic level, things that help a friendship help our relationship with God and things that harm a friendship harm our relationship with God. The most fundamental characteristic of a good friendship is time spent talking and listening. Without communication, there is no friendship. Additionally, that communication with a friend is open, honest, and deep. A good friend is one with whom we can be truly at home – i.e., where we can reveal our inner selves without fear of being rejected.

The keys to prayer are faith and fidelity. We must have faith that as we reveal ourselves to God, he will truly begin to reveal himself to us and we must have the fidelity to pray regularly – for God reveals himself only slowly, in much the same way as *knowing* someone (rather than merely knowing *about* someone) takes time. Mark out 15-30 minutes for silent prayer *each and every day*. The silence is absolutely key! The goal is to speak to God in the silence of our hearts and recognize his presence. It is fine to use an image or book to bring our attention toward God. In fact, using a text – such as the readings from the daily Mass or the writing of one of the saints – allows God to speak to us through those works. When we find our hearts stirred by the words, we stay there and rest until we decide to move on to the next words.

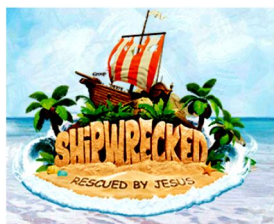
