SCRIPTURE REFLECTION / REFLEXION DE LAS ESCRITURAS

On True Riches

This Sunday, the readings speak about true richness. Many of us may be familiar with this gospel of the rich young man. However, if we take a closer view to the gospel, this young man is not really rich. Actually, this young man is a poor man, since he lacks the treasures of heaven. The gospel says that the young man went away sad, for he had many possessions and could not do what Jesus asked him to do. This sadness for feeling unable to be a disciple of Jesus Christ is the attitude of a spiritual homeless man. He might have been living in a palace as he met Jesus, but his spirit, which was created for eternity, was homeless. This young man was so poor that the only thing he had was a lot of richness and possessions.

Now we can see that the richest man in the world is the disciple of Christ, whether he has abundant or little material possessions in this world. The disciples are true witnesses that this teaching of Christ is authentic because they have left everything and yet they experienced the joys and happiness that the young man of the gospel was not able to experience. Today these disciples live in the company of saints for all eternity. Who could dare to say that the message of salvation is not true richness?

We are called to do the same act of faith as the disciples. We need freedom from the attachments of this world, especially of money and possessions, to follow Christ and to experience the joys and treasures of the kingdom of God. We can begin to taste the joys of the kingdom when we forgive someone, listen to the Word of God, receive the sacraments, practice almsgiving, and be in communion with our brothers and sisters.

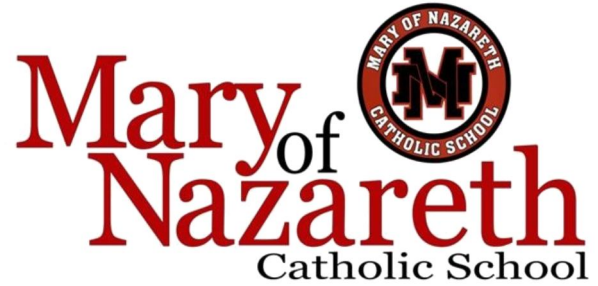
WANT TO GROW IN FAITH? BE AN RCIA SPONSOR!

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Following with our teaching on the sacrament of reconciliation, this week I will try to explain the difference between confession and spiritual direction, since a parishioner asked me last week the difference between the two. On the one hand, the sacrament of confession is when the penitent comes to confess in a simple way all his sins. The priest gives a few words of encouragement, a penance, and the prayer of absolution. The sequence of sins confessing gets easier when the penitent has done a good examination of conscience, he is repentant, and is catechized enough to discern between right and wrong. The conscience must be well informed about right and wrong. On the other hand, spiritual direction is to discern in a deeper level the movements of the Holy Spirit in the person. The spiritual direction takes longer and is not just a one-time experience. The spiritual director must know in depth the spiritual life of the penitent. The Catechism of the Catholic Church says that the Holy Spirit gives to certain faithful the gifts of wisdom, faith, and discernment. People with these gifts could guide people on the way of prayer and relationship with God. The penitent wishing to advance in the spiritual life should take care into whose hands he entrusts himself. So for as the Father is, so will be the son (CCC, 2690).

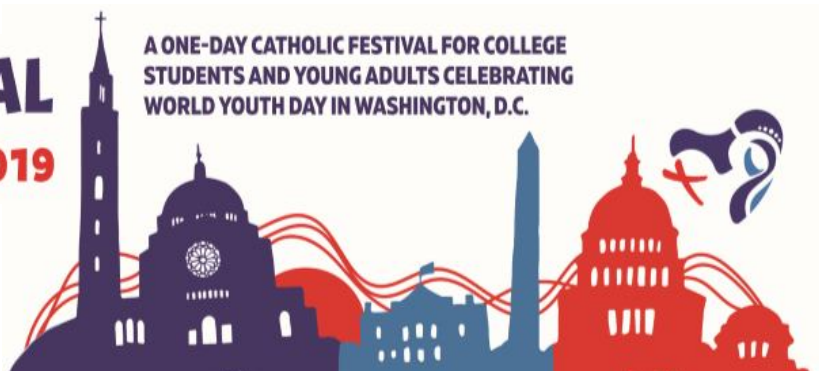

CORRESPONSABILIDAD****HOW ARE YOUR DONATIONS TO ST. ROSE USED?**

We will soon publish our annual Stewardship Report, which provides details about the many good works that are made possible and the many lives impacted through your generous gifts to St. Rose. Here is information about the three main parish funds to which parishioners donate:

Offertory funds are used for the parish operating budget, providing support for all St. Rose programs and ministries (i.e. faith formation for children, youth, and adults; social concerns and outreach ministries; music and liturgical ministries), facilities and maintenance expenses, staff salaries and benefits, and more.

The Offertory fund is subject to assessment by the Archdiocese at a rate of 12%, plus 3% for the Archdiocesan Schools Fund.

Debt Reduction/Mortgage funds are used to pay down the loan debt for the building of our church, completed in 2006.

Capital Campaign funds are for construction of the Gathering Space and to further pay down our loan debt.

Both the Debt Reduction/Mortgage and Capital Campaign funds are exempt from assessment by the Archdiocese.

Financial Fact

St. Rose obtains its casualty/property insurance through the Archdiocese of Washington. Our current fiscal year assessment is \$34,308 for all of our facilities. This represents a decrease of \$1,056 from last fiscal year's assessment, which amounted to \$35,364.
