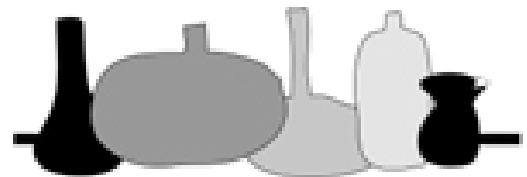

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION / REFLEXION DE LAS ESCRITURAS

The readings this Sunday speak about widows who have given up everything for the sake of God. The gospel not only speaks about generosity regarding money, since this is not the only aspect of our lives. In addition to that, the gospel speaks about generosity and richness that comes from poverty, which involves faith in God. The key passage can be "in her poverty, she has put in everything she had to live on." No one can ever do this, unless there is faith in God. Who can give everything to the point of death? God is the only one who has done this once by sending his only Son Jesus Christ to a wretched death and then resurrection so that we may have eternal life. We see how death in Christ give birth to more life. Through the grace in Jesus Christ, we his children may do immense acts of generosity to the point of death just as He did.

We have only one life and most of the time it is very poor because of our sins, weaknesses, struggles, and sufferings. Today God calls us to surrender this life of ours so that He may enrich others with our poor lives. Let us remember that we need faith to surrender our entire selves to Him. Many people in the Catholic Church have gone through this passage from poverty to richness. Most of these people are the saints. We are also called to become saints through our baptismal call. So, let us place our sins and poverty at the feet of God this Sunday so that we may experience the joy of being the richest persons in the world because of our eternal life in Christ. This experience of joy and life may lead us to share everything with others, money, time, goods, and even our own salvation of Jesus Christ with others.

Las lecturas de este domingo nos hablan de viudas que han dado todo por amor a Dios. El evangelio no solamente habla de la generosidad con el dinero, ya que el dinero es solo uno de tantos aspectos de nuestra vida. El evangelio nos habla de la generosidad que nace de la pobreza interna y externa que tiene mucho que ver con la fe en Dios. Las palabras claves pueden ser "en su pobreza ha echado todo lo que tenía para vivir". Nunca nadie puede hacer este acto de fe, al menos que ponga su confianza y fe en Dios. ¿Quién puede dar todo de sí hasta el punto de la muerte? Dios es el

único que ha hecho esto cuando envió a su único hijo Jesucristo a morir una muerte miserable de cruz y resucitar al tercer día para que nosotros tengamos la vida eterna. Vemos como la muerte en Cristo concibe mas vida. A través de la gracia en Jesucristo, como hijos de Dios que somos, podemos hacer inmensos actos de generosidad hasta el punto de la muerte como lo hizo Dios nuestro Padre.

Tenemos una sola vida y la mayoría de las veces nuestra vida es muy pobre por nuestros pecados, debilidades, sufrimientos, etc. Hoy Dios nos llama a entregar nuestra pobre vida a él para que Él nos enriquezca con su providencia. Recordemos que necesitamos fe para

abandonar por completo todo nuestro ser a Dios. Mucha gente en la iglesia católica ha pasado de la pobreza a la riqueza espiritual. Muchas de estas gentes son los apóstoles y los santos en la historia de la iglesia. Personas humanamente muy pobres pero que han enriquecidos a muchos con la gracia que recibieron por el encuentro con Dios. Pongamos entonces nuestros pecados y nuestra pobreza a los pies de Dios este domingo para que podamos experimentar la alegría de ser las personas más ricas del mundo por poseer la vida eterna en Cristo. Esta experiencia de alegría y vida puede conducirnos a compartir todo con los otros, nuestro dinero, tiempo, bienes, y hasta nuestra propia historia de salvación que Jesucristo ha hecho con

A parishioner asked me this week:

Why did Jesus have to die such a gruesome death to save us from our sins? It seems He could have been incarnate, taught as He did, died in a less horrible way and then ascended into heaven.

This is not a simple question. After reading this question, I asked myself why are people not just born, to live good lives, die in a nice way, and then go to heaven? Why do people have to sometimes go through so much injustice, violence, and catastrophe in life? I think that Jesus did not come just to teach us nice words about how to live a good life. He came to save us from sin, to suffer, to die, and rise again. He took upon himself the iniquities of all humanity, descended into hell to save the children of Adam and Eve, and opened again heaven for all who became his children. If we are one with Christ, then we would go through a similar experience as Jesus, taking upon ourselves the sins of people and carrying them for the salvation of humanity. The sufferings of innocent people are usually a scandal but are closely related to love. Jesus, being innocent, underwent sufferings to save us so that we also may enter freely into death and experience resurrection with him. If we have the Spirit of Jesus, we would go through sufferings out of love for others. If we do not have his Spirit, then we become a justice fighter, as Barabbas was during the time of Jesus.

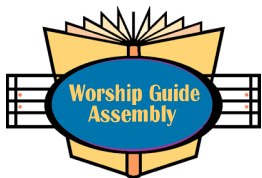
THANKSGIVING FOOD BASKETS
