SCRIPTURE REFLECTION / REFLEXION DE LAS ESCRITURAS

The Feast of Pentecost acquires importance and beauty, if we understand the reason to celebrate it. In the Old Testament, the people of Israel were not people as such until they received the Law at Mount Sinai. From this moment on, the Israelites celebrated the Covenant that made them one people. Before this covenant, they were just a group of people scattered after the confusion of languages at the tower of Babel. This was the history of the people of Israel before the covenant at Sinai.

In the New Testament, God makes a new covenant with a new people of Israel. This new people is the Church, that group of apostles from different parts of Israel who came together after Jesus called them. Like the people of Israel in the Old Testament, the apostles were not a Church until Jesus calls them and gathers them. The apostles did not form the Church from their own initiative, since they did not know each other before Jesus. They were working at their jobs and living their lives as everyone else. They also had their human differences and this divided them. For instance, some were zealots. Humanly speaking, they did not have a human reason to stay together. Division and enmity are main consequences of sin, and some of the disciples were living under these circumstances.

The Pentecost feast at the time of the apostles and today is the celebration of the Church. The tongues of fire and wind are essential symbols of Pentecost. After Jesus saves his people from the oppression of sin through his Passion and Resurrection, God sends his Holy Spirit in tongues of fire on top of the head of the apostles. They spoke in different languages, yet they understood each other. There is the gift of communion, unity. The Holy Spirit makes them one Church, so that they may proclaim the gospel to all the nations. This is the Church that God founded, and today she is present in all the continents of the world. It is not a human institution. He broke the human barriers that divided the apostles because of sin, and made them one to bring this grace throughout the world. This work of evangelization is not over. The evangelizing mission of the Church is always renewing. We need the Holy Spirit to teach us new ways to reach out those people who are without an ecclesial community, without knowing Jesus Christ, his love and mercy. Evangelization takes zeal, energy, sacrifice, sufferings, even to the point of death. For this reason, the color for today's liturgy is red, a symbol of fire, of that burning love with which the apostles proclaimed conversion, repentance, and the forgiveness of our sins in Jesus Christ.

May the Lord grant us this gift of communion as one Church here at our parish of St. Rose. We pray for this unity at every Mass during the Eucharistic prayer. This unity within the diversity of gifts is a work of the Holy Spirit.



La fiesta de pentecostés adquiere importancia y belleza si es que entendemos la razón por la cual la celebramos. En el Antiguo Testamento, el pueblo de Israel no era un pueblo como tal hasta que recibieron las tablas de la ley en el monte Sinaí. Desde ese momento, los Israelitas celebraron la alianza que Dios hizo con ellos como un solo pueblo escogido por él. Antes de esta alianza, ellos eran solo un grupo de personas esparcidos por todas partes, especialmente después de la confusión de lenguas junto a la torre de Babel. Esta fue la historia del pueblo de Israel antes de la alianza en el Sinaí.

En el nuevo testamento, Dios hace una nueva alianza con el nuevo pueblo de Israel. Este nuevo pueblo es la iglesia. Esta iglesia está compuesta por el grupo de apóstoles de diferentes partes de Israel que se reunieron como una comunidad después que Jesús los

llamo. Como el pueblo de Israel en el Antiguo Testamento, los apóstoles no eran una iglesia antes que Jesús los llamara y los reuniera junto a él. Los apóstoles no formaron la iglesia ya que no se conocían unos a otros antes que Jesús los llamara. Fue Jesús quien los llamo. Ellos, antes que Jesús los llamara, estaban como todos en sus trabajos y siguiendo sus vidas común y corriente. Ellos también estaban viviendo bajo las consecuencias del pecado, principalmente divididos. División y enemistad son las mayores consecuencias del pecado y algunos de los discipulos vivían en estas circunstancias.

La fiesta de Pentecostés en el tiempo de los apóstoles y hoy es una fiesta de toda la iglesia. Las lenguas de fuego y el viento son símbolos esenciales de Pentecostés. Después que Jesús salva a su pueblo de la opresión del pecado por medio de su Pasión y resurrección, Dios los envía su Espíritu Santo en lenguas de fuego sobre sus cabezas y hablaban en diferentes lenguas. Y a pesar de esta de diversidad de lenguas, se comprendían unos a otros. Ocurrió el milagro de la comunión, unidad. El Espíritu Santo los hace una iglesia para que proclamen el evangelio a todas las naciones. Esta es la iglesia que Dios ha fundado y hoy está presente en todos los continentes del mundo entero, pero a pesar de esto la misión evangelizadora no ha terminado. La misión evangelizadora de la iglesia está siempre renovándose y necesitamos el Espíritu Santo para enseñarnos nuevas formas para llegar a aquellas personas que aun hoy están sin una comunidad eclesial, sin conocer a Jesucristo, su amor y misericordia. La evangelización implica celo, energía, sacrificio, sufrimientos, incluso hasta el punto de la muerte. Es por eso que el color de la liturgia de hoy es el rojo, el color del fuego, el color de ese amor ardiente con el cual los apóstoles proclamaron la conversión, arrepentimiento y el perdón de los pecados en Jesucristo.

Que el Señor nos regale este don de la comunión como iglesia de Santa Rosa. Oremos por esta unidad como lo hacemos en cada Misa en la oración eucarística. Esta unidad en medio de la diversidad de dones es un regalo del Espíritu Santo para enriquecer a su iglesia.

15TH ANNIVERSARY MEMORIAL MASS OF MATTIE STEPANEK

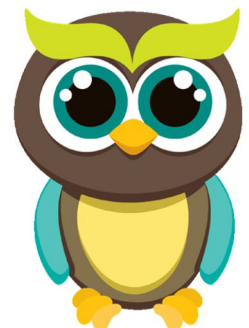

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Since today we are celebrating the feast of Pentecost, I decided to pick one of my favorite scripture passages that speaks about the work of the Holy Spirit. The passage is from Isaiah, Chapter 11. Isaiah speaks of the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit: wisdom, understanding, counsel (right judgement), fortitude (courage), knowledge, piety, and fear of God. It describes the Messianic age where these gifts will be present in the whole nature and, consequently, the wolf will dwell with the lamb, an infant will play over the hole of the asp, and a child will guide all this new creation. It sounds like poetry, but this is what Jesus Christ does with his grace in each one of us. He brings reconciliation and peace. With the gifts of the Holy Spirit, we can live in peace with the worst of our enemies. The saints lived this heavenly peace within them and made present heaven on earth. Since I was a child, I always wondered at this passage. Each Pentecost, I remember it and meditate on it.
