Reflection On My RCIA Journey - Alicia Thompson (received 1st Communion & Confirmation)

"God has worked in my life in amazing ways. My ability to let go and open my heart to God has increased ten-fold since I started my journey a year ago. I was baptized in the Catholic faith as an infant did not receive the rest of the sacraments. Religious practices were not supported or practiced at home. When I visited my grandparents during the summer, I joined them in prayer, learning the Our Father and Hail Mary prayers. At the beginning, it was learning about Mary and the Rosary as a way of learning about the Lord. My grandmother would tell me how happy she was that I was baptized and hoped that I would complete my initiation into the Church someday. I was curious about Mass and would join my grandparents whenever we visited. I was amazed at the beautiful detail of the statues and golden altar. My grandmother would kneel before Mary and I would join her feeling an inner peace. Ever since then, Mary has been a presence and I continue to admire her. What brought me to the Church was to find belonging and to be at peace. The factors that brought me back to God included the challenges of being a mom, having a mental illness, and the day-to-day demands of stretching myself between work and motherhood. Finding a foundation to take care of myself became more and more of a priority. I started praying the Rosary. It was a comforting way to welcome God back into my life. My past faith experiences and praying with my future husband Eric made a positive connection to exploring the Word and coming to worship at St. Rose. Eric attended St. Rose on a couple of visits and told me how welcoming everyone was. He urged me to attend and be open to God's presence. Sharing experiences and asking questions about the Catholic faith through the Precatechumenate classes helped me to find more and more resources to answer my growing number of questions. It brought me closer to Eric. Christine Jeffrey, my sponsor Anne Quinn, and Precatechumenate instructor Kathleen McMann helped me by their example of living by faith, and provided the support to guide me through my journey. They helped me understand the traditions and practices of the Catholic Church, gave me information on faith events and places to go based on my interest, guided me along my faith journey, and comforted me through the pain I experienced when my son received a diagnosis of Type 1 diabetes. Receiving the Eucharist healed me from the pain and anxiety of not having direction in my life. Receiving the Eucharist is the new beginning of forgiveness and love that I have been searching for."

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION / REFLEXION DE LAS ESCRITURAS

This week, we return to Ordinary Time. We begin with Trinity Sunday, followed by Corpus Christi next Sunday. These feasts prepare us for the beginning of our summer season. Thinking about the summer season, water, sea, shore, and entertainment, we have the teachings of St. Augustine of Hippo on the Trinity, especially the teaching of a small child at the seashore. St. Augustine was one of the greatest saints who studied and wrote extensively on the Trinity, as three persons in one God. According to the tradition, one day he was walking along the seashore and he sees a child playing in the sand. St. Augustine watched the child making a hole in the sand. The child brought water back and forth from the sea in a small shell and poured it into the little hole. St. Augustine was amazed at the child playing in this way and asked him what he was trying to do. The child answered that he was trying to bring all the water of the sea into the little hole. At this answer, St. Augustine said that it was impossible, since the water was just too much. So, the child answered that as it was impossible to bring all the water into the hole, so it was impossible for St. Augustine to understand the mystery of the Trinity just with human reason. St. Augustine needed the light of faith. After this answer, the child vanished.

This famous story of St. Augustine shows us that the mystery of the Trinity is too immense for our little human reason to understand it fully. In spite of this, we may still have an experience of the Trinity through faith. One of the main aspects of the Trinity is the perfect communion of three persons in one God at work for the salvation of humankind. We do have the opportunity to experience this communion of persons of faith in the Church for the salvation of many. As we approach the altar, let us take a look at the people around us in the Church and we will realize that there are many different people united in one God for the salvation of many. The three persons of God, Son, and Holy Spirit work for the salvation of all of us. Since we are created in the image of God, then we also were created to be in communion with each other in the faith so that many will come to know the plan of salvation of God. The Trinity is a community of persons with one purpose working in different ways.

The story of St. Augustine shows us that we cannot understand the whole mystery of the Trinity just with our human reason. But we can experience a bit of it every Sunday as we come to Mass as a community of faith constituted of different people. Every Sunday God gives us the opportunity to be one person with him by consuming his body and blood. If we are one with God, we may also be one with our brothers and sisters around us, especially those whom we have a hard time loving and forgiving.

Esta semana, regresamos al tiempo ordinario del año litúrgico. Continuamos con la fiesta de la santísima trinidad seguida por la fiesta de Corpus Cristi que será el próximo domingo. Estas fiestas nos preparan para el comienzo de la temporada de verano. San Agustín de Hipona es uno de los más grandes santos que tiene la iglesia católica. San Agustín estudio y escribió mucho sobre el misterio de la trinidad, tres personas en un solo Dios. De acuerdo a la tradición, un día San Agustín estaba caminando por la playa y ve a un niño jugando en la arena cerca de las olas. San Agustín observaba que el niño hizo un agujero en la playa y traía una y otra vez agua del mar en una pequeña concha y lo echaba en el pequeño agujero. Sorprendido como el niño se entretenía, San Agustín le pregunta al niño a que jugaba. El niño le contesta que trataba de meter toda el agua del mar en el pequeño agujero que hizo en la arena. San Agustín le contesta que era imposible de hacer eso ya que era demasiada agua. Entonces el niño le contesta que, así como es imposible que toda el agua del mar quepa en el agujero en la arena, así también era imposible que San Agustín entendiera con su razón humana solamente el misterio de la trinidad. Después de esta respuesta, el niño desapareció.

Esta famosa historia de San Agustín nos enseña que el misterio de la trinidad es muy grande para que nuestra pequeña mente humana pueda entender por si sola. A pesar de esto, podemos experimentar un poco de la vida trinitaria en la fe. Uno de los aspectos más grandes de la trinidad es la perfecta comunión de personas en un solo Dios en función a la salvación de toda la humanidad. Tenemos la oportunidad de experimentar esta comunión de personas en la iglesia para la salvación de muchos. Cuando nos acercamos al altar, miremos un momento a todas las personas alrededor nuestro en la iglesia que tal vez serán muy diferentes de nosotros. Todas estas personas están unidas en un solo Dios por medio de la fe para la salvación de muchos. Las tres personas de la trinidad, Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo viven para la salvación de todos nosotros en la iglesia. Nosotros fuimos creados a imagen de Dios. Es por eso que fuimos creados para vivir en comunión con Dios y con los hermanos en la fe para que muchos puedan conocer el plan de salvación de Dios. La trinidad es una comunidad de personas viviendo en diferentes formas con un propósito.

La historia de San Agustín nos muestra que no podemos entender todo el misterio de la trinidad con nuestra pobre mente humana, pero podemos experimentar un poco de la vida trinitaria cuando venimos a la iglesia o en nuestras familias por medio de la fe. Cada domingo, Dios nos da la oportunidad de estar en comunión con el comiendo de su cuerpo y bebiendo de su sangre. Si somos uno con Dios comiendo de su cuerpo en la eucaristía, podremos también ser uno con nuestros hermanos y hermanas alrededor nuestro, en especial aquellos a quienes no podemos amar y perdonar.
