SCRIPTURE REFLECTION / REFLEXION DE LAS ESCRITURAS

This Sunday, our Lord Jesus Christ provides us with two important aspects of discipleship, namely, humility and poverty. In the sacred scriptures, humility is modesty as opposed to vanity. It is the attitude of the sinful man before the almighty God. The humble man recognizes that he has received all from God. On the other hand, when we hear the poor, crippled, the lame, the blind, the scriptures refer to the poor in spirit. Many of us are not physically impaired, but because of sin and weaknesses, we are always spiritually handicapped. The poor in spirit believe more easily in the Good News of the heavenly banquet to which the Messiah invites them. Those who praise God and beg him to save them are frequently the poor in spirit because they are hungry for the food of eternal life and the healing that comes with it. Humility goes hand in hand with poverty of spirit. Jesus Christ humbled himself and became poor for our sake for our salvation as Saint Paul recounts in his letter to the Philippians 2:1-11.

Saint Augustine said that "wherever is humility, there is also charity." Those who clothe themselves with humility in their relationships with one another seek the interest of others and take the last place. Pride separates us from our brothers and sisters because it seeks its own interest rather than the interest of others. Now, we can understand a bit more the parable of the wedding banquet. The proud guest comes and sits at a place of honor because he thinks that there are no other more distinguished guests than him. The virtue of humility always leads us to consider others superior to oneself, to the spirit of the servant of God. Consequently, it leads us to service of others as Jesus himself did at table with his disciples.

Jesus Christ is the host at the wedding banquet and he invites everyone to his banquet. If we are sincere with ourselves, none of us are worthy guests because of our sins. We should not have been invited at all in the first place, since we were the enemies of Christ as we were in our sins. Only friends of the bridegroom are invited to the wedding banquet. Yet, Jesus Christ washed away our sins at our baptism and made us worthy to be part of his wedding banquet every Sunday, thanks to his redeeming blood on the cross. Let us not think that we are today present at the Lord's banquet because we deserve it. Instead, let us clothe ourselves with humility and believe that we are eating his body and blood because God loves the poor sinners and is merciful with us.

We are partakers of the heavenly banquet because of mercy, rather than because of our merits. We cannot repay God for his immense love and so we classify as poor, lame, crippled, and blind. It only remains to have a grateful heart to God and we give him thanks by raising the cup of salvation at each Mass. This is the attitude of the humble one who slowly ascends to high levels of faith so that one day he may join God in the heavenly banquet.

Este domingo, nuestro Señor Jesucristo nos proporciona dos aspectos importantes del discipulado, que son la humildad y la pobreza. En las sagradas escrituras, la humildad es modestia en oposición a la vanidad. Es la actitud del hombre pecador ante el Dios todopoderoso. El hombre humilde reconoce que ha recibido todo de Dios. Por otro lado, cuando escuchamos a los pobres, lisiados, cojos, ciegos, las escrituras se refieren a los pobres de espíritu. Muchos de nosotros no tenemos impedimentos físicos, pero debido al pecado y a nuestras debilidades, siempre estamos como discapacitados espirituales. Los pobres en espíritu creen más fácilmente en la Buena Nueva del banquete celestial donde el Mesías los invita. Los que alaban a Dios y le ruegan que los salve son frecuentemente pobres en espíritu porque tienen hambre del alimento de la vida eterna y de la curación que eso conlleva. La humildad va de la mano con la pobreza de espíritu. Jesucristo se humilló y se hizo pobre por nuestro bien para nuestra salvación, como San Pablo relata en su carta a los Filipenses 2: 1-11.

San Agustín dijo que "donde hay humildad, también hay caridad." Aquellos que se revisten de humildad en sus relaciones con los demás buscan el interés de los demás y toman el último puesto. El orgullo nos separa de nuestros hermanos y hermanas porque busca su propio interés en lugar del interés de los demás. Ahora, podemos entender un poco más la parábola del banquete de bodas. El orgulloso invitado viene y se sienta en lugares de honor porque piensa que no hay otros invitados más distinguidos que él. La virtud de la humildad siempre nos lleva a considerar a los demás superiores a uno mismo, al espíritu del siervo de Dios. En consecuencia, nos lleva a tomar el último puesto y al servicio de los demás como lo hizo Jesús mismo en la mesa con sus discípulos.

Jesucristo es el anfitrión en el banquete de bodas e invita a todos a su banquete. Si somos sinceros con nosotros mismos, ninguno de nosotros somos huéspedes dignos debido a nuestros pecados. En primer lugar, no deberíamos haber sido invitados, ya que éramos los enemigos de Cristo como lo fuimos cuando estábamos en nuestros pecados. Solo los amigos del novio están invitados al banquete de bodas. Sin embargo, Jesucristo nos lavó de nuestros pecados en nuestro bautismo y nos hizo dignos de ser parte de su banquete de bodas todos los domingos gracias a su sangre redentora en la cruz. No pensemos que hoy estamos presentes en el banquete del Señor porque lo merecemos. En lugar de eso, vistámonos con humildad y creamos que estamos comiendo su cuerpo y su sangre porque Dios ama a los pobres pecadores y es misericordioso con nosotros.

Somos partícipes del banquete celestial por misericordia y por nuestros méritos. No podemos pagarle a Dios por su inmenso amor, así que somos parte del grupo de los pobres, cojos, lisiados y ciegos. Solo nos queda tener un corazón agradecido con Dios y le damos gracias alzando la copa de salvación en cada Misa. Esta es la actitud del humilde que asciende lentamente a altos niveles de fe para que un día pueda unirse a Dios en el banquete celestial.

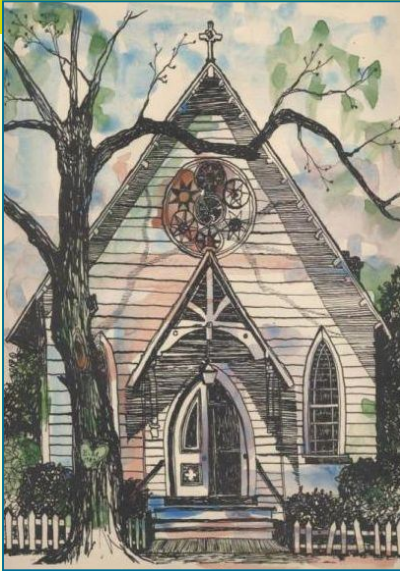

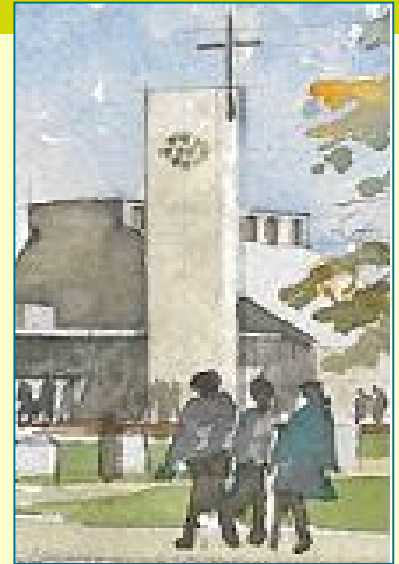
