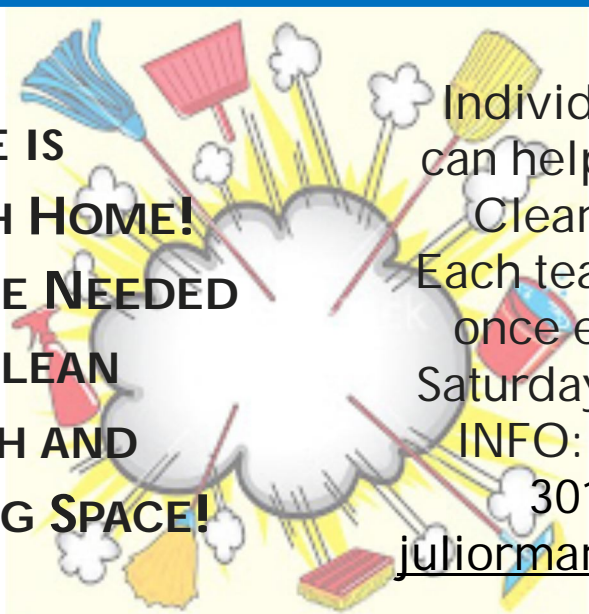

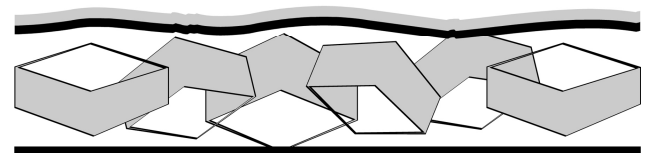

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION / REFLEXION DE LAS ESCRITURAS

For the next three Sundays before the beginning of Lent, we will read the gospel of Matthew chapter five, which is on the Sermon on the Mount. Jesus went up to the mount, sat down, and began to describe the blessed, the heavenly man and his mission in the world to his disciples. This heavenly man is blessed because he will give testimony of the truth, suffer, and die, but rise again to a new life. Jesus is describing what he himself will undergo with his public ministry. The beatitudes are not a poetic words abstract from reality or utopic. Jesus himself will fulfill to the letter this sermon and later on his disciples with the courage and help that comes from the Holy Spirit. The gospel of today follows the sermon and emphasizes the symbols of salt and light. Jesus speaks about the salt and light referring to his mission and that of the Church into the world. Jesus Christ came to be that lump of salt and that light, which will give flavor of life and light to the whole world.

In the ancient world as today, salt was indispensable to have a healthy life. For instance, being so valuable, soldiers in the ancient Roman army were sometimes paid with salt instead of money. Their monthly allowance was called "salarium", "sal" being the Latin word for salt. Just some lumps of salt can season a whole stew, keep a wound free of infection, keep the body hydrated, or preserve food for longer period without rotting it. It was a valuable element to survive. Jesus used the symbol salt to speak about the mission of the Church in the world. He said to his disciples, "You are the salt of the earth. But if salt loses its taste, with what can it be seasoned?"

The Christians who follow Christ faithfully and are true witnesses in the world through the power of the Holy Spirit become these few lumps of salt that can season the whole world. The whole history of the Church is full of these disciples and saints who gave faith, hope, and love to others, even to entire countries. Actually, in the early Church during the preparation of catechumens for baptism, the bishop would give a lump of salt to the catechumens to teach them their mission as future Christians in the empire. As the salt dissolves to release his benefits, so the Christians had to dissolve themselves in the world by giving their lives so that others may receive life. In this way, each faithful Christian who became a saint would flavor the Church and the world with new vigor and life. Jesus Christ himself went through this by giving his life for the redemption of all humankind. Now, we can better understand as Jesus says, "if salt loses its taste, with what can it be seasoned?" If we lose our faith in society and conform ourselves with this life, then we are as useless as flavorless salt.

This week on February 11, we also remember the World Day of the Sick. St. John Paul II designated this date as a special time of prayers and sharing, of offering one's suffering for the good of the Church and remind us to see in our sick brothers and sisters the face of Christ who, by suffering, dying, and rising achieved the salvation of all.

Durante los próximos tres domingos antes del comienzo de la Cuaresma, leeremos el evangelio de Mateo capítulo cinco, que habla del sermón de la montaña. Jesús subió a la montaña, se sentó y comenzó a describir a los bienaventurados, al hombre celestial y su misión en el mundo. Este hombre celestial es bendecido porque dará testimonio de la verdad, sufrirá y morirá, pero resucitará a una nueva vida. Jesús está describiendo lo que él mismo sufrirá en su ministerio público. Las bienaventuranzas no son palabras poéticas abstractas de la realidad o utópicas. Jesús mismo cumplirá al pie de la letra este sermón y luego sus discípulos lo cumplirán también con la fuerza y la ayuda que proviene del Espíritu Santo. El evangelio de hoy es la continuación del sermón y enfatiza los símbolos de la sal y la luz. Jesús habla de la sal y la luz en referencia a su misión y la de la Iglesia en el mundo. Jesucristo llegó a ser esa pizca de sal y esa luz, que dará sabor a vida y la luz a todo el mundo.

En la antigüedad como hoy, la sal era indispensable para una vida saludable. Por ejemplo, por ser tan valioso, a los soldados del antiguo ejército romano a veces se les pagaba con sal en lugar de dinero. Su paga mensual se llamaba "salario", siendo "sal" la palabra latina para sal. Solo algunas pizcas de sal pueden sazonar un guiso entero, mantener una herida libre de infección, mantener el cuerpo hidratado o conservar los alimentos durante un período más prolongado sin refrigerar. La sal es un elemento valioso para sobrevivir. Por eso tal vez Jesús usó el símbolo de la sal para hablar sobre la misión de la Iglesia en el mundo. Él les dijo a sus discípulos: "Ustedes son la sal de la tierra. Pero si la sal pierde su sabor, ¿con qué se puede sazonar?"

Los cristianos que siguen a Cristo fielmente y son verdaderos testigos en el mundo por el poder del Espíritu Santo se convierten en estos pocos trozos de sal que pueden sazonar al mundo entero. Toda la historia de la Iglesia está llena de estos discípulos y santos que dieron fe, esperanza y amor a los demás, incluso a países enteros. En la Iglesia primitiva durante la preparación de los catecúmenos para el bautismo, el obispo les daba un trozo de sal a los catecúmenos para enseñarles su misión como futuros cristianos en el imperio. A medida que la sal se disuelve para liberar sus beneficios, los cristianos también tuvieron que disolverse en el mundo dando sus vidas para que otros puedan recibir la vida. De esta manera, cada cristiano fiel que se convirtiera en santo daría sabor a la Iglesia y el mundo con un nuevo vigor y vida. Jesucristo mismo pasó por esto dando su vida por la redención de toda la humanidad. Ahora, podemos entender mejor cuando Jesús dice, "si la sal pierde su sabor, ¿con qué se puede sazonar?" Si perdemos nuestra fe en la sociedad y nos conformamos con esta vida, entonces somos tan inútiles como la sal sin sabor.

Esta semana, el 11 de febrero, también recordamos el Día Mundial de los Enfermos. San Juan Pablo II designó esta fecha como un momento especial de oraciones, de ofrecer el propio sufrimiento por el bien de la Iglesia y recordarnos que debemos ver en nuestros hermanos y hermanas enfermos el rostro de Cristo que, al sufrir, morir y resucitar alcanzó la salvación a todos.
