Our Lady of Holy Rosary

Have you called your mom yet? October is the month of the Holy Rosary, the tremendous means to “get back in touch with mom.” According to tradition, the devotion to the Rosary was revealed to St. Dominic by the blessed Virgin. It is one the most highly indulged of all devotions and both a vocal and a mental prayer. Vocally, we recite the Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be. Mentally, we meditate on the great mysteries of our Faith. The church urges all of us to offer her a crown of roses, i.e., the Rosary. The church wants us not so much to recall a distant victory but to discover Mary’s place in the mystery of salvation and to greet her by saying Hail Mary without ceasing. When Mary gave her consent to God at the annunciation, “she committed herself wholeheartedly to God’s saving will and, impeded by no sin, she devoted herself totally, as the handmaid of the Lord, to the person and work of her Son, under with Him, serving the mystery of the redemption by the grace of Almighty God” Praying the Rosary has many, many benefits. It’s a traditional prayer based on meditation. For Catholics looking for more contemplative modes of prayer, encourage the Rosary. The rosary can bring families together; gathering for just a few minutes after the dinner will change a family! But meeting to pray the rosary will also change groups in the parish. Bringing people together doesn’t have to involve rolling out a complicated program. Why not gather in front of an image of our lady on Saturday or Sunday pray the Rosary? The most beautiful thing about the rosary, to borrow from Saint Augustine, is that it is “ever ancient, ever new.” We can pray it over and over again, always discovering something new in the course of our prayer.

Dear Parishioners, The Sunday Gospel says, “As Jesus was leaving Jericho with his disciples and a sizable crowd, Bartimaeus, a blind man, the son of Timaeus sat by the roadside begging. On hearing that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to cry out and say, ‘Jesus, son of David, have pity on me’” (Mark 10:46-47). How could we not pause and remark on the words: “on hearing that it was Jesus of Nazareth”? The blind man, the one who cannot see, responds in faith to what is heard. Elsewhere in scripture, St. Paul says, “faith comes from what is heard, and what is heard comes through the word of Christ” (romans10:17). St. Thomas Aquinas points out that hearing is twofold. He writes, “One is internal, by which one hears from God revealing... the other is that by which someone hears another man speaking in his presence.” The blind made Bartimaeus possessed both senses of hearing. He heard on the surface level that Christ was there, but he also heard something deeper about Christ. It is from this internal sense that he cries out to the Lord for pity and healing. **Like Bartimaeus, may we have both dimensions of hearing!**
