Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday the Church presents to us the opportunity to mediate on the Holy Cross, the tree of life. The prophet Ezekiel write, “and all the tree of the field shall know that I, the LORD, bring low the high tree, lift high the lowly tree, wither up the green tree, and make the withered tree bloom.” The Lord alone can take the dead wood of the Cross and transform it to be a dwelling place!

St. Theodore the Studite writes, “How precious the gift of the cross, how splendid to contemplate! In the cross there is no mingling of good and evil, as in the tree of paradise: it is wholly beautiful to behold and good to taste. The fruit of this tree is not death but life, not darkness but light. This tree does not cast us out of paradise, but opens the way for our return.” The tree of paradise, the tree which became the occasion of sin for our first parents, has been replaced with a new more wondrous arbor! Jesus’ sacrifice makes it possible for the tree of life to bloom anew, to flourish.

But the cross cannot be merely a sign or symbol. We must live in accordance with the life promised by this new tree. Pope Francis teaches, “the cross cannot but express love service, unreserved self-giving: only in this way is it truly the tree of life’, of overabundant life.” Let us then renew our lives, bringing our thoughts and actions ever more completely into conformity with the pattern of life of our savior.
