Dear parishioners,

In this Sunday’s gospel we encounter a woman desperate to be near Jesus. “She said, ‘if I but touch his clothes, I shall be cured.’” The Greek word used in the text for touch (hapto). Rather than simply mean “to come into contact with”, it means “to cling to, to grasp.” Thus we might interpret the text as meaning not only did she “touch” Jesus, but she grasped, that is held tightly to him. This believing woman confidently put her healing, her fate, in the hands of the lord. But we might also interpret the word more broadly. The Greek word hapto can also mean to light, to kindle. The example of the woman, clinging to Christ is for us a light. She kindles our faith by longing to imitate her, by desiring healing as she desired it, or by wanting to have the faith in Jesus that she had, she can spark the light of faith for us. Her struggle toward Christ is our struggle. Her confidence in him can be ours too.
