Mission Appeal July 24th and 25th

Diocese of Rourkela is in the state of Odisha which is in the east of India. The diocese was created in 1979 and has 43 parishes with the Catholic population of 274,344. There are 87 diocesan priests, 105 religious priests and 434 religious nuns involved in pastoral work and faith formation. The Catholics are poor tribal who live in the interior rural villages depending upon agriculture and forest products. Due to rampant mining in our area the tribal are constantly forcefully alienated from their land and displaced without due compensation and social security. Hoping to give them a bright future and strive to make them strong in faith amidst these difficult socio-economical situations, we have established regional language schools without the aid of government. These schools are the breeding ground for many vocations and religious life. But the diocese finds it very difficult to manage these schools with local contributions. Yet the diocese wants to continue to give quality education as well as the faith formation to these people. Trusting in God’s providence, we appeal to you for help, financial assistance and prayerful support to provide quality education and to strengthen the faith of our people. God Bless you all!
