



COVID FLOWCHART FOR STUDENTS

For COVID-19, **Close contact** includes living in the same household of an infected person, being within 6 feet of infected person for at least 10 continuous minutes, or being in direct contact with secretions from the infected person. (12/4/2020)

Student reports they are **positive for COVID-19.**

Student will isolate from school for **10 days** from symptom onset or **72 hours** symptom free (including no fever without fever reducing medication) whichever is longer.

If student is able to isolate, siblings remain home for 10 days from date of last exposure to their sibling or 7 days with a negative PCR test on or after day 6. If the student is unable to isolate, the siblings remain home for 10 days from the end of the positive case's isolation period or 7 days with a negative PCR test on or after day 6. (20 or 17 total days)

The School will notify Dr. Jamie Finkeldei at the Catholic School Office and together they will contact trace.

Student has a fever of 100.4 F or higher or has **1 major or 2 or more moderate symptoms** BEFORE entry to building.

Student may not enter the building. Student/Parent should contact their primary care physician for guidance on whether testing is required.

The student, and their siblings, may return after receiving a negative COVID test result or having been diagnosed by a doctor with a different cause of illness and has been symptom free for at least **24 hours**, without the use of fever reducing medication.

If the student tests positive, refer to column one.

Teacher identifies any other student or staff who have been exposed (within 6 feet for at least 10 minutes) on the previous two days the student who tested positive was present. Teacher will report those persons to the principal.

Student reports **experiencing 1 major or 2 or more moderate symptoms** during the school day.

Student is sent home or moved to the isolation room until parents can pick them up and refer to column two.

- Current known symptoms (major in bold):
- Fever (100.4 or higher)**
 - New loss of taste or smell**
 - Shortness of Breath**
 - Rigors
 - Muscles and body aches
 - Fatigue
 - Headache
 - Sore throat
 - Cough
 - Chills
 - Diarrhea
 - Nausea/Vomiting

The school will work with the local health department to send written notification of possible exposure to all staff and parent/guardian of students who were exposed.

Student reports **someone at home has a major symptom, is being tested, or has tested positive.**

Student cannot enter the building. If symptomatic family member tests negative and the student has no symptoms, the student may return.

If the positive family member is able to isolate, children remain home for 10 days from date of last exposure or 7 days with a negative PCR test on or after day 6. If the positive family member is unable to isolate, the siblings remain home for 10 days from the end of the positive case's isolation period or 7 days with a negative PCR test on or after day 6. (20 or 17 total days)

Student reports **someone in their home was exposed to someone who tested positive or has symptoms.**

If someone at home is not symptomatic, but just 'exposed,' student may come to school.

There is no need to self-isolate if the student is a contact of a contact.

All student and staff who were exposed will be excluded from school for 10 days from date of last exposure or 7 days with a negative PCR test on or after day 6. Those persons will need to monitor their symptoms at home and contact their doctor.
