FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK – JUNE 21, 2020

My dear parishioners and friends,

The phrase "Do not be afraid" appears in the Bible about 70 times. In our gospel passage today Jesus tells us, "Do not be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows." What Jesus seems to be saying is that our heavenly Father cares for us so much that we have no need to fear anything that might happen in this life. These are consoling words at a time like this when it feels as though we have so much to fear, but I submit there is a difference between fear that is irrational and fear that is justified. The first kind of fear is not helpful...it leads to making panicked decisions or it paralyzes us into making no decisions at all when we MUST do something to respond to a real threat.

Jesus' words in today's gospel assure us that whatever challenges we face, God is always with us in our need. We are not alone to face life's challenges. Knowing that God is with us, we CAN face those challenges and not be overwhelmed by our fear. In that place of calm in the midst of the storm we are able to make good decisions, wise decisions, effective decisions. We can evaluate the situation and adjust to changing circumstances as they develop. This is how all the gifts of the Holy Spirit can be brought to bear and used effectively to address the problems that confront us.

Brothers and sisters, as we continue to seek the safe path to re-open our church let us take Jesus' words to heart. We have no need to fear because God IS with us. God is guiding us with a wise and gentle hand. The Holy Spirit is inspiring us to make informed and enlightened decisions about how we can address the situation that confronts us. We have NOT allowed our decisions to be influenced by irrational fear, rather we have chosen to make decisions based on the best advice available. This is the best we can do.

This week we have only one Sunday mass, 11:00 AM. We are still restricted by the State guidelines to allow only 50 persons in attendance at that mass. Next weekend, because we have additional volunteer helpers, we will have a 5:00 PM mass on Saturday and the 11:00 AM mass on Sunday. Gradually, as conditions permit, we will be able to accommodate a few more than the 50 persons we can have at present, but that time is not yet. Once again, please consider whether you are "at risk" and make a good choice about whether or not to attend mass. The Archbishop has indefinitely dispensed all Catholics from their "Sunday obligation" so do NOT feel compelled to attend mass out of fear. This is NOT a time for scrupulosity to get the better of you! Do not put your life and your health at risk. Also, if any of you is feeling "under the weather" or running a fever, we ask you please DO NOT come to the church. You may be jeopardizing the life and health of others. We take this seriously and we ask you all to take this situation seriously. We are not acting out of irrational fear, but making good decisions based on the best advice we have available at this time.
