GOSPEL REFLECTION:

Matthew 28:1-10 Psalm 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23

John 20:1-9

"Are you not aware that we who were Baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death?" -Romans 6:3

To know the risen Christ in a life-changing, deathconquering way, we must be baptized in His name (Acts 2:38). If we are already baptized, we must renew our Baptisms and live them. In this way, we become aware that we "have been raised up in company with Christ" (Col 3:1). In Baptism, we know the risen Christ.
