Each year, thousands of people come to the US after being forced to flee violence and persecution in their home countries. They often come with only the clothes on their backs and the shoes on their feet. Unfortunately, the shoes they do bring are either in extremely poor condition or just not suitable for their new environment. Without proper footwear, it's difficult for adults to get job interviews and children to go to school.

The Catholic Center will be holding a shoe/sock donation drive in partnership with two student organizations at UGA, Best Foot Forward and RefUGA. All donations will be distributed directly to refugees who have been relocated in the Athens and Atlanta areas.

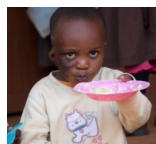
