### CATHOLIC QUESTIONS

#### What is the difference between a Franciscan priest and a "regular" priest?

At the Catholic Center, the priests do not wear black clerical collars but rather large brown "habits," signifying that they are Franciscan friars. How is this different from the regular diocesan priests that one might find at other parishes?

In the Catholic Church, there is only one priesthood that all priests share, but it can be lived in one of two ways. Diocesan priests, also called "secular" priests, are defined by their direct relation to the bishop. They join a particular diocese and largely remain in that diocese their whole lives. Of Christ's threefold ministry of priest, prophetic, and king, they find their identity and holiness through priestly (sacramental) works.

Franciscans, on the other hand, are what are called "religious" priests, men who are a part of a religious (like the Dominicans, Jesuits, Benedictines, etc.) Their direct superior is not the bishop but rather a member of their order, who reports to Rome. They may live and work in any diocese in which a bishop grants them permission. Of Christ's threefold ministry, they find their identity and holiness in their prophetic nature, sharing the charism of their founder with the world through their communal lives.
