

Message from our Pastor

Happy Easter, Alleluia, Alleluia!

I Hope this bulletin finds all our Sacred Heart families safe and well. As we celebrate the Third Sunday of Easter, we see two disciples of Jesus walking away from Jerusalem in despair after the death of Jesus. Yet Jesus appears and walks alongside with them and reveals Himself at the breaking of the bread.

To the question "where is the resurrected Jesus?", today's Gospel provides an answer as it focuses that he is with us every step of our ways, especially when things are so difficult. When someone says "the whole world is suffering, not just you" it doesn't really console us, but scares us even more.

When the "pause" began in the state of New York and the whole world, it was very upsetting and sad for many of us for not being able to celebrate the Masses together in our Church. Personally, however, it has also been a time of grace and blessings because many of us also have experienced our risen Lord walking along side with us every step of the way.

Though the outcome has not been as good as we expected, we keep trying.

When we couldn't get in touch with our parishioners, our school principal, Mr. Christopher Siegfried, offered to reach out by an Iris Alert, which many of you have heard computer generated voice message, and sending out E-mini bulletins with the You Tube link, so the parishioners can participate at the Mass with just one click.

I have also experienced the suffering of Jesus in the families with many children, who have lost jobs and looking for food. But the risen Lord comes to us in many forms. I thank God for Alexis and Lou Ventre and Mr. Park from the Korean community for their tremendous effort to feed the hungry that we were able to double the amount of our food pantry and that we had more than enough for everyone in need.

But most of all, I thank God for our rectory staff and all the volunteers for reaching out to all of our parishioners, when many thought they were alone and abandoned. I Thank God for the sisters at Marian Woods, who now are reaching out to our senior parishioners to see if they have any needs.

And I thank God for all of you, all our parishioners, for your continuous prayers and support. Our risen Lord comes to us in many different forms. Things are still difficult, but the Lord has indeed risen. We can be hopeful for He is with us and walking along side with each and every one of our Sacred Heart parish families.

Message from our Parish Council President

My dear fellow Sacred Heart Parishioners,

I hope you are well, safe and filled with Easter joy as I write this message to you. The last few weeks have been extremely difficult for our world, our nation, our community and our families. Our entire way of life has been upended, and it can be frightening, frustrating and overwhelming. I hope you see our parish as one of the many rays of hope during this difficult time.

A few weeks ago, Fr. Michael and I discussed the possibility of virtual Masses. Unfortunately, this undertaking was a little more difficult than we initially thought- we realized we did not have e-mails for the majority of our parish, so it would be difficult to inform the parish of our intention to bring Mass to everyone's home. Eventually, we updated some e-mails, and we got to work. I learned how to make a Facebook group and a YouTube account. I never really made social media videos before, and by no means am an expert, but we have tried to provide at least 2 Masses per week as well as Stations of the Cross and recordings of the Triduum liturgies. I am still learning about uploading, but we have been able to provide some Masses for our Parish. We are looking at ways to improve both the visual and sound quality of the videos. We also would like the opportunity to provide Live Broadcasts, though we struggle with this currently as we do not have enough followers on our social media platforms to do so. We need 1000 "subscribers" to our YouTube channel before we can go Live on a mobile phone, and we currently do not have a web camera that provides quality sound and quality resolution. But, what we do have (so far) we have offered so that our community can have some opportunities to stay connected. And that's what I keep going back to when I'm frustrated or upset about not being good enough (yet) as a social media person-what I can offer, I do, in service to our Parish.

So, if you have seen our videos, and prayed with us, thank you. If you haven't yet, I encourage you to view them- the link to the YouTube page is in the bulletin. And, if you could search for Sacred Heart Hartsdale in Facebook and YouTube, "like" and "subscribe", we might have more options to provide more quality content in the coming weeks. Also, if you know anything about social media and recording, please reach out to me at igoldwasser33@gmail.com and give me some much needed guidance!

I miss praying and praising with you all in person. I look forward to the day where we can safely gather again in one place, our beautiful Church, to sing praise to our God. Until that time, I pray that you are safe, and that you know we are a family of believers, and I hold you close to my heart through my daily prayers.
