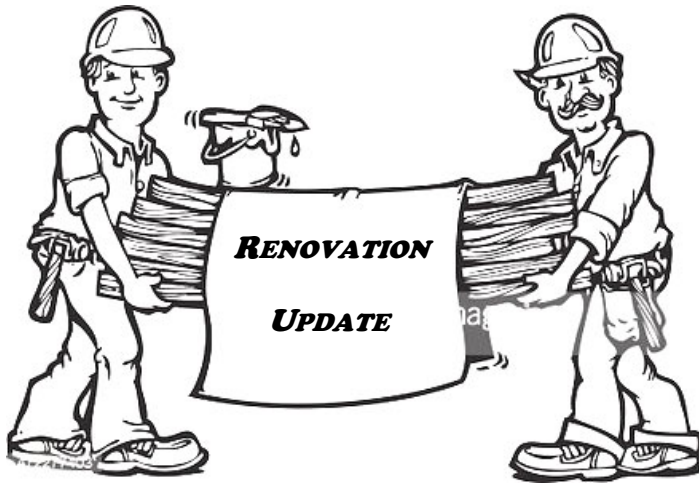

During the week of June 15 to 19, the stairs leading from the church to the basement and the choir loft stairwell both were removed. Rotted support beams under the floor of the bell tower were replaced. The Baptistry walls were taken down and a temporary wall installed to shield the congregation from construction debris and unsightly work in progress. The next steps entail installation of fire-resistant wall board around the boiler room and between the meeting areas, brighter lighting and a ventilation system, before replacing the ceiling. At present, your generosity has brought \$ 63,000 to the Building Fund, in addition to the proceeds from "Renew & Rebuild" back in 2017-18.

**A JULY 4TH LIKE NO OTHER . . .**



*I'm as corny as Kansas in August,  
High as a flag on the Fourth of July!  
If you'll excuse an expression I use,  
I'm in love with a wonderful guy!*

These lyrics from the Rogers & Hammerstein musical "South Pacific" are themselves "as corny as Kansas in August." But that was the point, wasn't it? Set on a Pacific Island during World War II, the play presents American military personnel in an idyllic and peaceful island paradise, all at their charming, witty and lustful best. The actual war only intrudes near the end of the story, where two themes break through the cheeriness with powerful irony. Navy Nurse Nellie Forbush, on a truly "enchanted evening," falls for the French aristocrat and resistance leader, Emile de Becque. She and his cute little Polynesian wards school the audience about racism, singing "You Have to Carefully Taught." Then DeBecque and the other male lead, Marine Lieutenant Joseph Cable, who has fallen for an "island girl," fly off on a doomed mission. The great American ideals are paraded before us: patriotism, bravery in the face of danger, self-sacrifice, a belief in human equality. Corny, sure. But it is both boiler-plate American credo and Morality 101

Next weekend's national holiday will be an Independence Day like no other: few parades; sporadic barbecues; limited travel. But it offers us a chance to reflect on the rights and duties we have as Americans. Even though the holiday celebrates the Declaration of Independence, illustrations often include the first words of the Constitution. It says, "WE the people," not "I, the person." Yes, we have freedom -- hard fought and re-won many times over since 1776. In the 1960s, there was a popular singing troupe called "Up With People." It was sponsored ( ironically ) by a powerful Conservative Party consortium. The singers signature song said, "Freedom isn't free / You've got to pay the price, / you've got to sacrifice / for your liberty." Too many Americans mistake freedom for license. Our personal freedom is bounded by our nation's laws and our credal morality. Masks; social distancing; revision of policing laws; equitable redistribution of assets -- it's all part of being "high as a flag on the Fourth of July."

*Church law requires, as a matter of justice, that a priest fulfill the promise he has made to offer Mass for a donor's intention. The "announced Masses" in our parish fall under that requirement.*

*The cancellation of Masses during the Covid-19 pandemic created a situation almost unique in the experience of the Church. Even in our small parish, dozens of Mass intentions have gone unfulfilled. The priest is expected to fulfill these intentions as the donor desires.*

*In our parish, I have decided to move each unfulfilled intention to the nearest available weekday after the celebration of Mass for the public has resumed. In some cases, there will be no problem because the original intention was chosen and arranged by me. In other cases, the donor simply asked for a Mass, without any date attached.*

*Finally, there are donors who desired a particular date. Some donors chose a date significant to the life of the deceased. Some requested a "Sunday Mass." The list below names each intention, the donor's name where possible, the original date of the Mass and the new date assigned to the intention.*

*For some time now, there have been no Saturday night or Sunday morning Masses available in all of 2020. Beginning in 2021, one of the three weekend intention must always be "For the People," thereby limiting the number of weekend Masses available for your intentions.*

*You might notice that some Masses originally scheduled earlier in the year have been reassigned to dates later in the year than some of those originally booked for later in the Spring. This has happened because some intentions were rescheduled for March and early April when we thought this distancing would be short-term. The earliest reassigned Masses had to be reassigned a second time.*

*If you had arranged for one or more of the intentions listed below, and you are not satisfied with the replacement date I have chosen, please contact me at your convenience. You can call, mornings 10 AM to Noon ( longer hours on Tuesdays and Thursdays ) or e-mail: stjoswurts@frontiernet.net.*
