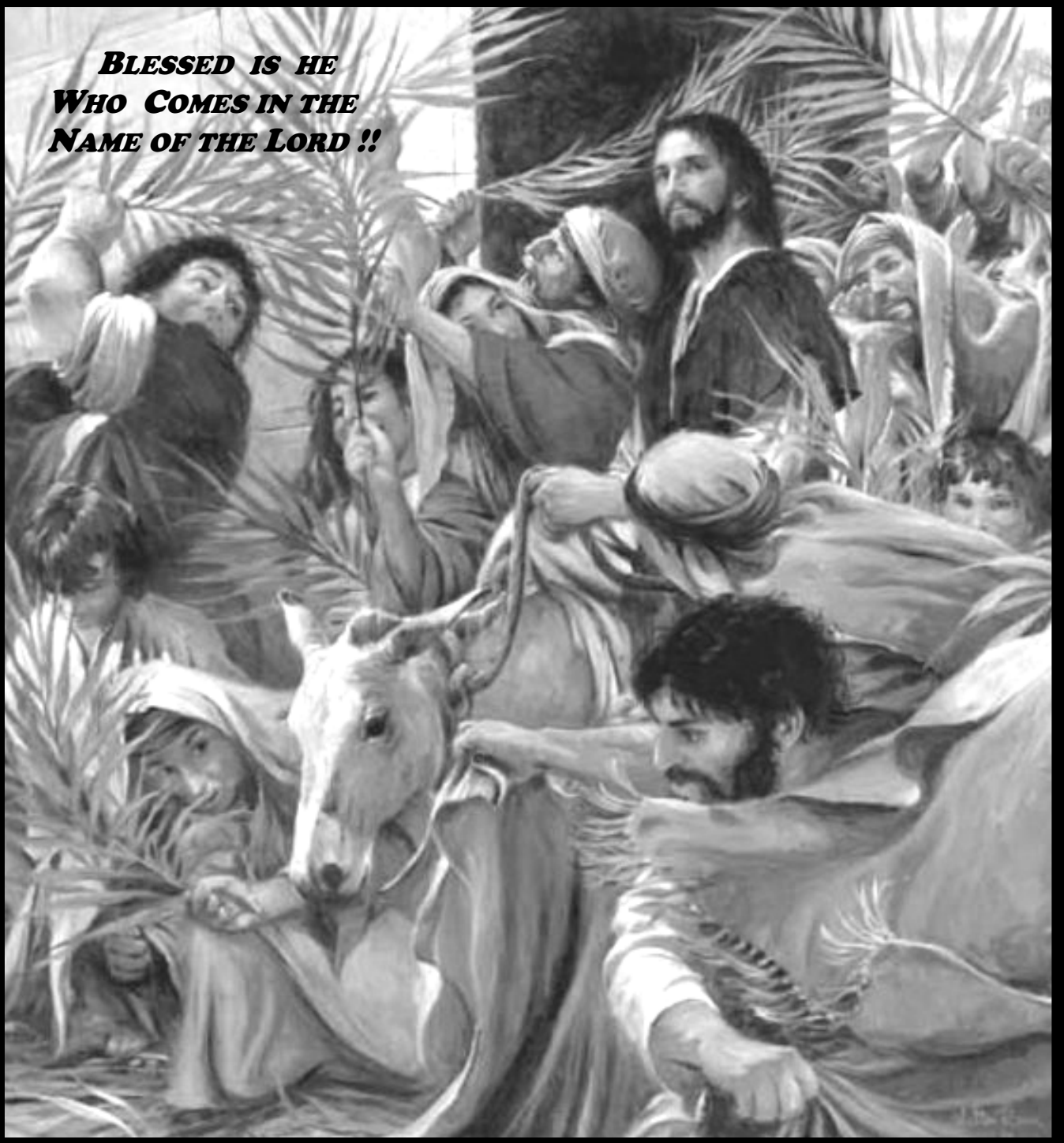

Schedule for Holy Week & Easter

Confessions, Tuesday, March 30, 4:00 to 7:30 PM

Every Archdiocesan parish will be open for confessions from 4 to 9 PM on Monday of Holy Week. However, because of the pastor's dialysis, OUR PARISH will offer the Sacrament of Penance on Tuesday, March 30. Celebrate God's mercy! No matter how long it's been since your last confession -- weeks, years, even decades! What better time to start over than Holy Week?!



Holy Thursday, April 1

7:30 PM MASS of the LORD'S SUPPER
Repository open 'til midnight

Mass is not celebrated on Holy Thursday morning. The Evening Mass, called the "Mass of the Lord's Supper" ordinarily concludes with the transfer of the remaining Eucharist to the Repository. These consecrated hosts are given to the faithful who attend the Solemn Liturgy of Good Friday. Because of the Covid-19 restrictions, we have been instructed to replace the Eucharist in the tabernacle as we would after a regular Mass rather than processing to a repository at a separate location. People may visit for prayer until midnight.

Good Friday, April 2

Church open all day for prayer & reflection.

7 PM SOLEMN LITURGY

Mass is never celebrated on Good Friday. The "Solemn Liturgy of Good Friday" takes place some time after three o'clock. In our parish, it is scheduled for 7 PM, when working people can attend. It consists of the proclamation of the Passion from Saint John's Gospel; the Universal Prayers; the Veneration of the Cross and Holy Communion. This year, because of Covid-19, no one may kiss the cross. You may come forward, keeping a 6-foot distance, and bow before the cross. No other services are held.

Saturday, April 3, 7:30 PM - Easter Vigil Mass

The First Mass of Easter begins after sundown. We light a new fire; carry the "Light of Christ," the Paschal Candle, into the darkened church as into a tomb; honor the risen Lord in chanted prayer; hear Scriptures tell the story of God's love from Adam through Christ; renew our own Baptismal promises; and celebrate the Eucharist as a people risen in Christ. We are cautioned against letting everyone in the congregation hold lighted candles. We will propose an alternative when people arrive for Mass.



Easter Sunday, April 4 - 8:45, 10:15 & 11:30

All Easter Masses will be celebrated in the Summer Church Hall. The usual Sunday time schedule has been altered to include a third Mass. Expect worshipers to attend in greater numbers than during Lent and give Christ the praise for their presence in our community!
