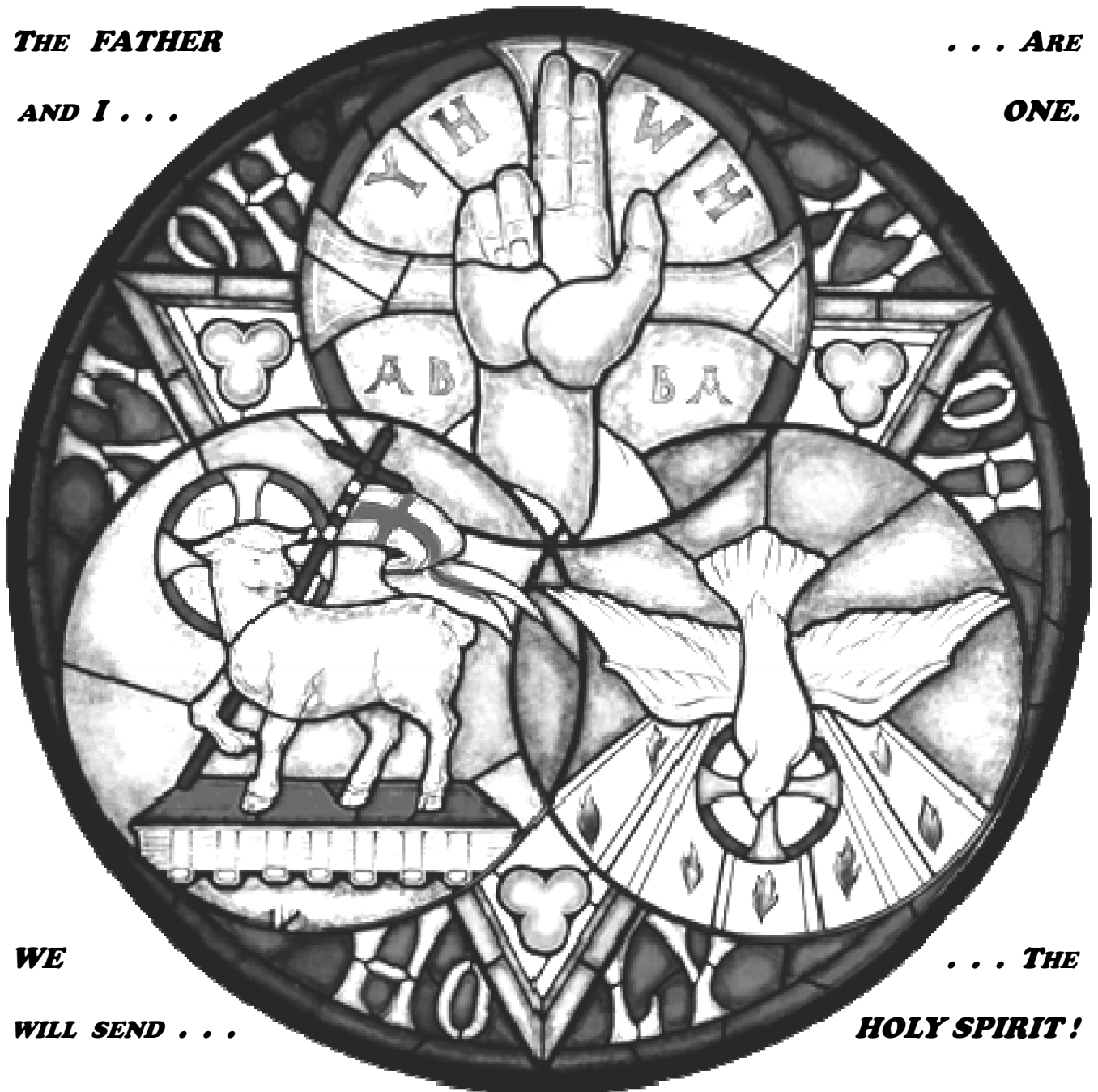

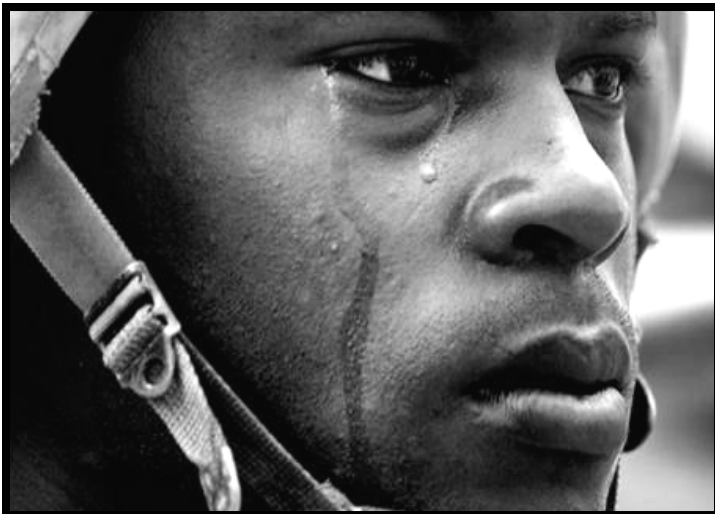

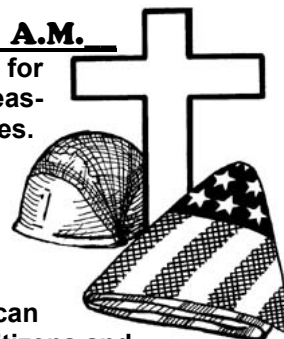

**MEMORIAL DAY MAY BE A
HARBINGER OF FUTURE SAINTS**

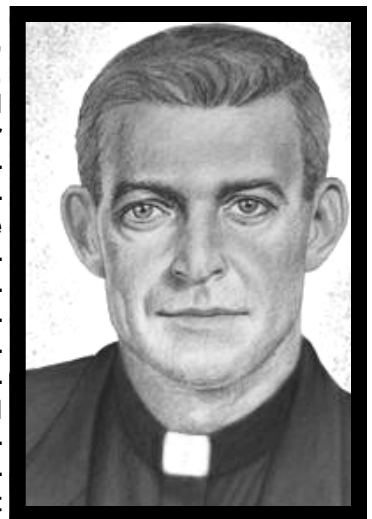
Two Catholic priests, Fr. Emil Kapaun, and Fr. Vincent Capodanno, are proposed for canonization. Both were chaplains during some of America’s most difficult wars. One in the U.S. Army; the other a Navy Chaplain assigned to the U.S. Marines.

EMIL KAPAUN was commissioned a 2nd Lt. in the US Army in 1944, seeing service as a chaplain in the Burma Theater towards the end of World War II. Briefly leaving the Army for graduate studies, he was sent back into combat during the Korean War. Using the hood of a jeep as his altar, he celebrated Mass, sometimes even while under withering enemy fire. Taken prisoner, he was marched by force to a Chinese prison camp. There he often stole food and medicine from Chinese storage sites to feed the malnourished and aid the sick POWs. Fr. Kapuan would also go without his own meager rations for considerable

periods of time, having volunteered them to others. He incurred the wrath of his Chinese guards for halting the executions of wounded American troops by tackling or shoving the executioners. Fr. Emil Kapaun died in captivity. His body was thrown in a mass grave along with the remains of

VINCENT CAPODANNO,

a Staten Island native, was ordained a Maryknoll priest. Volunteering for military service after ordination, he was commissioned an officer in the Navy. In 1966, Fr. Capodanno felt called to deployment in Vietnam, ministering to infantry Marines embroiled in the brutal conflict. He served with the 7th Marine Regiment. Affectionately referred to as “The Grunt Padre” for his willingness to go into combat and assist in administering aid to casualties, he extended his tour in Vietnam, this time with 5th Marine Regiment. In 1967, in an outnumbered fight, Fr. Capodanno repeatedly pulled fallen Marines out of danger, sustaining critical wounds himself. Refusing to be evacuated, he continued onward, tending to the wounded and giving Last Rites to the dying. A burst of machine gun fire finally cut him down as he shielded another marine from enemy fire with his own body. He posthumously received the Medal of Honor.



Servants of God, Father Vincent and Father Emil, pray for us. And may the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.
