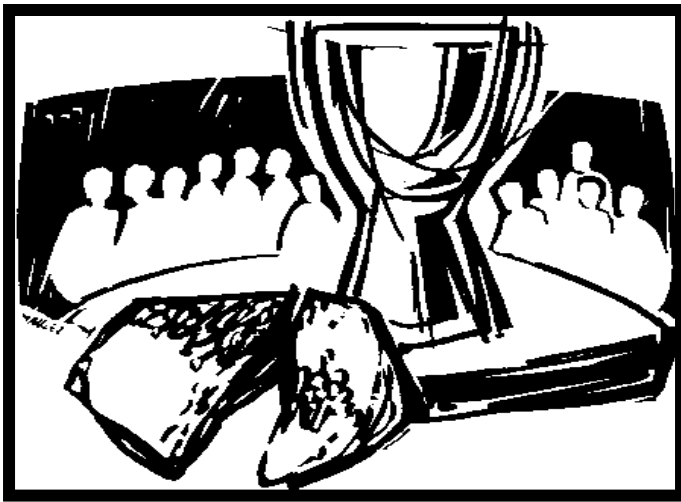

DUAL SPECIAL COLLECTION NEXT WEEKEND

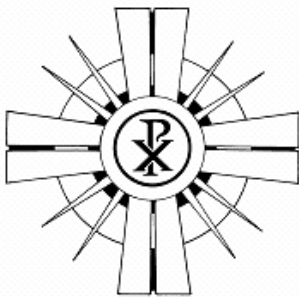

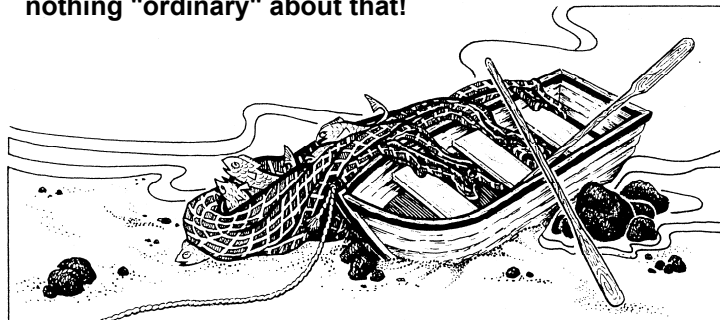
the weather. The weekend of May 23 was summery; Memorial Day weekend, a washout. But, then, that is a longstanding Wurtsboro tradition !!

EXTRAORDINARY "ORDINARY" TIME

A glance at the Mass intention schedule on page 2 tells us that we're back in "Ordinary Time." That's not the "I'm baaaack!" of Jack Nicholson in "The Shining." Nor does it indicate "the same old, same old," of humdrum day-to-day. Ordinary Time is called "ordinary" not because it is common but because the weeks of Ordinary Time are numbered. The Latin word *ordinalis*, which refers to numbers in a series, stems from the Latin word *ordo* -- from which we get the English word *order*. The numbered weeks of Ordinary Time represent the ordered life of the Church -- the period in which we live our lives neither in feasting or in penance. Advent, Christmas Season, the Epiphany Octave, Lent and Eastertide are those special times focussed on the key events in the history of our Salvation. All the other days of the year are the numbered days of each month. But there's nothing "ordinary" about them. In the Scriptures at Mass, we have the opportunity to hear larger portions of some of St. Paul's Letters and Old Testament books; the Gospel is a semi-continuous reading, this year from St. Mark. Green vestments and altar cloths represent the times when the Church, founded by the risen Christ and enlivened by the Holy Spirit, grows as we share the Gospel with all nations. The life of our Church -- remembered, celebrated and enriched during our "high seasons" -- goes on as the calendar pages turn. We are quietly, steadily engaged in the great task of salvation to which Christ has called us. The "God with us," heralded at Christmas; the "Body broken for You" of Holy Week; the "Breath of Christ" recreating the world on Easter Day; the "Witnesses" created by the Holy Spirit on Pentecost -- all these find their fulfillment throughout each year of Faith. And there's nothing "ordinary" about that!
