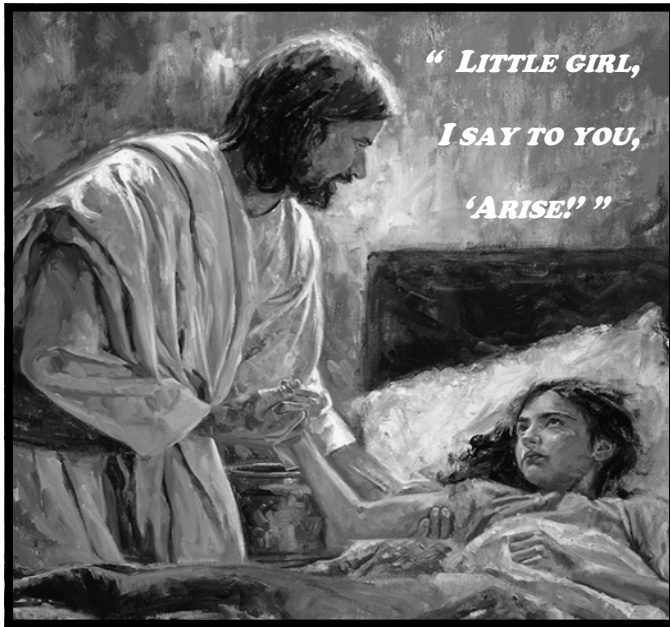

INDEPENDENCE DAY MASS INTENTIONS:
"FOR THE PEOPLE"



Although all of the "founding fathers" would have held some church membership, even if only for appearance sake, their personal beliefs were often less doctrinal. Some certainly were devout Christians (Charles Carroll of Maryland was a Catholic), but many -- especially the leading lights such as Jefferson and Franklin -- were "deists." The Enlightenment ethos of the Eighteenth Century would have accepted the notion of a Supreme Being as rational, without a corresponding acceptance of the God of Old Testament Scripture or Jesus, the Incarnate God of the New. All the more remarkable, then, was their insistence that "all men . . . are endowed by the Creator . . . with certain unalienable rights." [Emphasis added.] And despite our living today in a pluralistic society, the body politic still pledges allegiance to "one nation under God indivisible." Next weekend, as we celebrate our nation's birth, it's especially appropriate that we who do believe in a Personal Divinity offer our prayers for our country and its people.
