## FROM FATHER CONNER

### 2018 SJOA AWARD RECIPIENTS

It will be a pleasure to present the SJoA award to them next Sunday at the luncheon immediately following the 10:00 am Mass. I hope you are planning to participate. The luncheon is a thoroughly delightful event. It is appropriate, moreover, that we make the time and effort to honor these wonderful parishioners and celebrate with them and their families. Congrats to this year's recipients!

### AWAY THIS WEEK

I, along with Deacon Deshotel and a handful of men parishioners, am heading up to a monastery in Oklahoma this week. We leave Monday morning after holy Mass and return Friday evening. The name of the monastery is **Our Lady of Clear Creek Abbey**. It's located just outside of Wagoner. We will spend time living as the monks do, following their daily (and nightly) schedule of prayer, work, and recreation. I ask your prayers for safe travel and fruitful prayer. I mention our trip so that you will be aware of my absence this week, but also to draw attention to the monks and their monastery. They are Benedictine. This means their religious order was founded by St. Benedict of Norcia. They have a website: [www.clearcreekmonks.org](http://www.clearcreekmonks.org) I encourage you to familiarize yourself with the monastery, the monks, and their schedule. In so doing, you can *keep an eye on us* while we're gone. (LOL!) Additionally, should an emergency arise while I am away, the emergency number is on the answering machine. I am grateful to Father Pellerin and Father Jose for making themselves available to assist should the need arise.

### MORE CONSIDERATIONS OF THE EF

We continue our brief considerations of the observances specific to the EF, that is, how the EF and OF sometimes differ from one another ...

#### **1. Liturgical Year / Reading Cycle / Saints Feast Days ...**

- a. Like the Ordinary Form, the Extraordinary Form has its own way of reckoning time. Practically speaking, you will notice very soon that the missalettes in the pews do not contain the prayers or readings for the EF Mass. The reason for this is that these missalettes are for the OF Mass only. (It's important to understand that there is a separate and distinct missal for the OF and a separate and distinct missal for the EF.) As we draw closer to having a Sunday EF Mass, I want you to know SJoA will print out EF Mass Propers for each Sunday so that you can have the prayers of the Mass with you during the Mass. The printed Propers, along with the red booklets containing the Ordinary of the Mass, will be at the main entrance. These two resources will provide you with the entire Mass formula for that particular Sunday or feast day.
- b. I personally think that it is a good idea for every Catholic (either each individual Catholic or each Catholic family) to own a hand missal. SJoA can help you obtain both (or either) at a low cost. Call the Rectory if you're interested in purchasing a hand missal for either form of the Mass.

#### **2. Silent Canon ...**

- a. The Canon of the Mass (more commonly known these days as the "Eucharistic Prayer") is prayed silently in the EF. In the Book of Revelation (cf. **Rev. 8:1 ff**), a series of "seals" are opened. When the mysterious seventh seal is arrived at, the "Lamb" opens it, upon which all of heaven falls silent for 30 minutes in adoration. Something similar occurs at each (EF) Mass. As the Word takes flesh upon the altar during the consecration, awe very fittingly settles upon everyone present (even the Priest!). In the face of such a sublime mystery, the only appropriate response is to adore in utter silence. This silence at holy Mass is something of an actualization of the words of **Habakkuk 2:20**: "The Lord is in His holy temple; let all the earth keep silence before Him." In my opinion, this is one of the more mystical observances of the EF.
- b. In the future, I will comment with more length on the appropriateness of the "silent canon," noting also why the Eucharistic Prayer *should* be prayed silently in the **QF**. There are many who mistakenly believe that a silent canon is forbidden in the OF. This is based, however, on what is called "the **hermeneutic of rupture**."

#### **3. Our Father ...**

- a. In the EF, the *Pater Noster* (Our Father) is prayed by the Priest *alone*. The congregation does *not* pray it audibly with the Priest. Neither do other Priests, Deacons, or Subdeacons if they are present. Even the choir does not sing along with the Celebrant. The Our Father is reserved to the Priest alone because it is considered a "collect," or priestly prayer, which is signified by the Priest extending his hands while praying.
