2018 SJOA AWARD RECIPIENTS

The SJoA Award, as you may remember, was established 3 years ago to honor parishioners who have given a lifetime of service to God and SJoA. The award is presented to a couple of, or a few, parishioners each year during our Parish Luncheon on the Sunday nearest the Feast of St. Joan of Arc. We do that today! Please join me congratulating the Berrys and Mrs. Smith. We thank them for their faithful, humble, and generous example of Christian discipleship and love of God.

MAY 30TH – SOLEMNITY OF ST. JOAN OF ARC

The actual feast day of SJoA is May 30th ... that's this Wednesday. To commemorate our heavenly patroness properly, we will have a beautiful EF High Mass at 6:00 pm. I hope you're able, and willing, to join us. And don't forget that a plenary indulgence may be obtained by **1)** visiting a church on its patronal feast day, **2)** praying the Creed and Our Father, and **3)** fulfilling the other *usual conditions*. Confessions will begin at 5:30 pm.

MAY 31ST – OF FEAST OF THE VISITATION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

This Thursday we will have a beautiful **Latin** High Mass in the *Ordinary* Form for the Feast of Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The readings will be chanted in English, but the rest of the Mass will be in Latin. Confessions will begin at 5:30 pm. I hope you will join us for this beautiful Mass commemorating Our Lady's visit to St. Elizabeth.

NEEDING HELP WITH THE UPKEEP OF ST. JOSEPH CEMETERY

The bulletin of two Sundays previous had an excellent article on *tithing*. Because of an inadequate formation with respect to tithing, many tend to equate any discussion whatsoever of tithing simply to avarice on the Priest's part. Rather, we should see tithing for what it really is: a natural consequence of having received so much from the Good God, and as a requirement of the virtue of justice. (We do, after all, have the duty of transmitting the faith.) Tithing also reminds us that there's no part of our life in which God is not interested. Our Blessed Lord made this abundantly clear in saying that "even the hairs of your head are all numbered." (**Matthew 10:30**) With this in mind, I want to make an appeal to a specific type of tithing noted in the recent Joe Sixpack bulletin entry.

As we continue making progress at St. Joseph's in Soileau (Yes, we are making progress ... and we would make even more progress if a greater number of parishioners would make themselves available to Deacon Deshotel.), ***I would like to ask you to consider helping us with the upkeep of the cemetery.*** Now that summertime has arrived, we have a regular need of keeping the grass cut. Thankfully there is a family who has volunteered to mow the grounds of the church and cemetery. But we also need someone to weed eat the grounds, especially the cemetery. We need volunteers who own weed eaters to contact the Rectory. Depending on the weather, the grounds need to be mowed and trimmed each week or every other week. Can you help us? If several people volunteer, the burden will be greatly reduced. **This strikes me as an excellent way for families with sons / grandsons in high school and college to assist SJoA.** Please consider this request and contact us at the Rectory. Thank you.

ON RENTING THE PARISH HALL

Because of the highly litigious nature of present day society, and with the best interest of SJoA in mind, I have determined that the Parish Hall will no longer be rented out. This decision, which is effective immediately, is based on sound legal advice and has the support of the Parish Finance Council. The Hall will continue to be used for regular parish activities (e.g., youth events, CCD, etc). We will also continue hosting families for meals after a funeral (upon their request **and** the Hall's availability). Your understanding is appreciated.

THE COMMUNION FAST AND THE EXTRAORDINARY FORM

"Is the Communion fast longer in the Extraordinary Form?" No. The Communion fast is identical for each Form of the Roman Rite. At the very minimum, a person must, in addition to being in a state of grace, refrain from eating or drinking anything (other than medicine and water) for at least one hour before the reception of Holy Communion. A fast longer than the very minimum is, of course, recommended.
