Hello, my friends,

I'm Father Joe Cronin, the new pastor here at St. Thomas Church. I want to thank everyone for the warm welcome. I know that it's not easy to lose Father Nick who has been part of your family for so many years. Change can be difficult. My prayers are with him as begins his new ministry in Wethersfield. I pray for you in this time of transition as well. I promise that I will do my best to work with you to make this time easier to bear as we continue to serve the Lord by loving our brothers and sisters in Southington.

Let me tell you a few things about myself. I have been an ordained priest for 19 years. My most recent assignment was at Our Lady of Victory and St. John Vianney parishes in West Haven. I was there for fourteen years: three as the assistant, one as administrator, and ten as pastor. Before that, I was the junior curate at SS. Peter and Paul parish in Waterbury. This is my third priestly assignment.

I am the seventh of eight children; we are loud and lively crowd! Avon is my home town. (I have gone from Northington to Southington!) After graduating from Avon High School, I was off to Roger Williams College where I earned a Bachelors of Architecture. Upon graduation, I entered St. Thomas Seminary for pre-theology, studying theology and Scripture. I then went to St. John Seminary in Boston where I earned my Masters of Divinity and my Masters of Art in Hebrew Scripture. Sacred Scripture is my great love and lead me to by priestly calling.
