Father Joe's Notes



My dear friends,

I have spent much of my spare time over the last month doing home improvement projects. I've been working in the rectory to prepare the parlor as a meeting space so we can reorganize the offices to work better. I painted my bathroom and began to tackle some gardening issues in the courtyard. At my parents' home, I have been hanging shades and valances in the office and have been choosing paint colors for bedrooms. I've helped my parents eliminate some of the clutter that has accumulated over the 38 years they have been in the house. It has been a summer of multiple home projects.

Any homeowner knows that you have to do work to keep it beautiful and functional. Over time, things fall apart and piles accumulate. We often are unaware of the issues that develop with miniscule changes over the course of years. Things just become part of the background of our lives and it's easy to ignore items that aren't immediately pressing. Sooner or later, we see that there's work that must be done. That's when we get the paint, break out the screwdriver, or grab the pruning shears. The work has to be done. It's best not to put things off too long or the issues just get worse and the projects become more involved.

While we're aware of this issues with our physical homes, we aren't always so aware of the work that needs to be done with our spiritual home. (Don't worry, I am not speaking now about the state of the church to hit you up for money – not yet! That comes in the fall.) We live with our souls every day. We may not notice the small changes in our relationship with God over the course of time. Maybe we get lazy in our prayers. Maybe things that use to work for us are no longer so helpful. Maybe concerns in our lives have so overwhelmed us so that we have forgotten about seeking God. Things aren't a disaster, but they might be out of order. This is a good time to get to work. Maybe we could refocus our prayer life or try something new. All relationships can use some improvement, even the one we have with the Lord. In these last weeks of summer, we could use the time to make the changes to make our spiritual homes much more comfortable and useful. It is a good time for some spiritual renovations.
