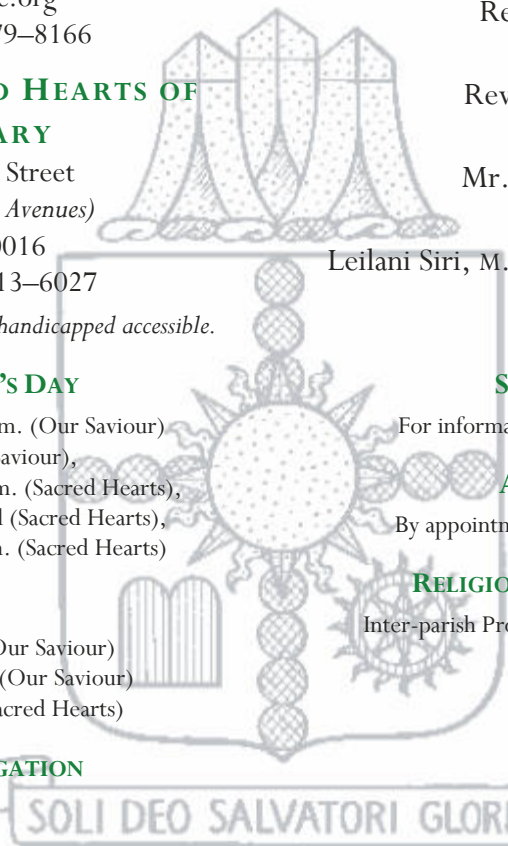

MUSIC NOTES

At the 11:00 a.m. Mass, the Choir sings the *Missa Brevis in C*, K.220 by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart (1756–1791). The *Missa Brevis* (Short Mass) was composed in 1775 or 1776. It is known as the “Sparrow Mass” because of a figuration played by the violins in the Sanctus and Benedictus that resembles the chirping of birds. It follows restrictions laid out by Archbishop Colloredo, the Prince-Archbishop of Salzburg, under whom Mozart was employed as a court musician. The Archbishop held a very austere view toward music in the liturgy and thus demanded brevity and simplicity in orchestration (the Mass was written for two trumpets, two violins and bass).

BEREAVEMENT SUPPORT GROUP

A Bereavement Support Group is being organized for those grieving the death of a loved one. The weekly sessions will help guide people through their grieving process in a safe and supportive environment. This group will provide the opportunity to share with others, learn about the process of grief, and find comfort during this difficult time. The program facilitator, from Epiphany Parish in midtown, has completed the Archdiocesan training program in Pastoral Bereavement Ministry.

The seven-week series will begin Thursday, 4 October at the Church of the Epiphany, 375 Second Avenue at 22nd Street. COLLECTION FOR ST. JOSEPH’S SEMINARY

This is why it is the duty of all of us to support these men who will eventually support all of us.

Our priests and deacons form and inform, they nourish and strengthen us, and they heal and guide the people of God throughout their lives as Catholics.
