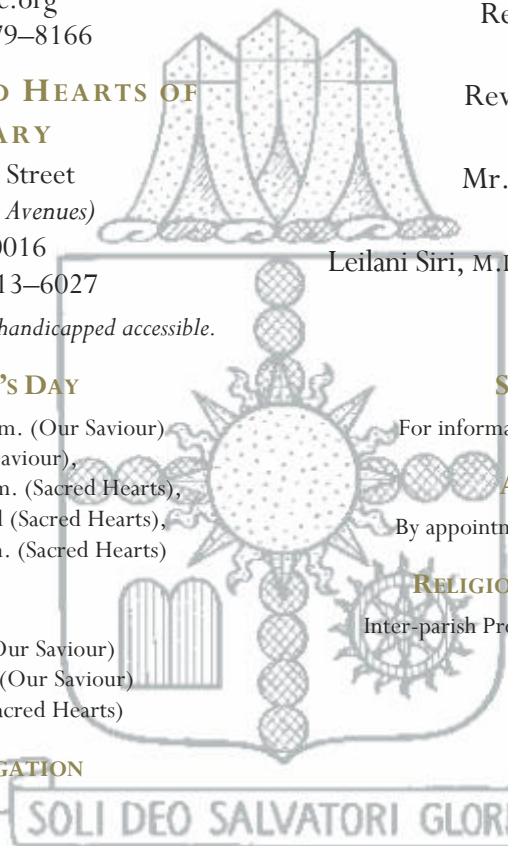

THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

“It is the Lord” (*John 21:7*). This exclamation of the Apostle John emphasizes the intense emotion experienced by the disciples on recognizing the risen Jesus, who appeared to them for the third time on the shore of the Sea of Tiberias. After a long night of loneliness and toil, the dawn arrives and his appearance radically changes everything: the darkness is overcome by the light, the fruitless work becomes an easy and abundant catch of fish, the feeling of tiredness and loneliness is transformed into joy and peace. Since then, these same sentiments enliven the Church. If at a superficial level it sometimes seems that the darkness of evil and the toil of everyday life have the upper hand, the Church knows with certainty that the light of Easter now shines eternally on those who follow Christ. The great message of the Resurrection fills the hearts of the faithful with inner joy and renewed hope. — *St. John Paul II*

The **PASCHAL CANDLE** represents Christ, the Light of the World. The pure beeswax of which the candle is made represents the sinless Christ who was formed in the womb of His Mother. The wick signifies His humanity, the flame, His Divine Nature, both soul and body.

Five grains of incense inserted into the candle in the form of a cross recall the aromatic spices with which His Sacred Body was prepared for the tomb, and of the five wounds in His hands, feet, and side.

During the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night the candle is carried in procession into the dark church. A new fire, symbolizing our eternal life in Christ, is kindled which lights the candle. The candle, representing Christ himself, is blessed by the priest who then inscribes in it a cross, the first letters and last of the Greek alphabet, (Alpha and Omega “the beginning and the end”) and the current year, then affixes the five grains of incense.

The Easter candle is lighted each day throughout the Easter season until Pentecost Sunday.

Sunday, 12 May, immediately following the 12:45 p.m. Mass, we will have the annual **MAY CROWNING** of the statue of the Blessed Virgin Mary at the Chapel of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary. All are invited to attend.

MOTHER’S DAY TRIDUUM: Enrollment envelopes are available in the narthex of the Church and the lobby of the Chapel for you to enroll your mothers, living and deceased, to be remembered in a Triduum of Masses for Mother’s Day, Sunday, 12 May. Please return your envelopes by Friday, 10 May.

PRAY THE ROSARY: According to ancient tradition, May is the month of Our Lady, the Blessed Virgin Mary. Take some time to pray to Our Lady and entrust your intentions to her care. The Rosary is prayed every Sunday after the 9:00 a.m. Mass at Our Saviour and after the 12:45 p.m. Mass at Sacred Hearts. All are welcome to join the small group of parishioners who pray the Rosary together.

The **SECOND COLLECTION** this Sunday is the monthly collection for the restoration and maintenance of our parish buildings. Thank you for your generosity.

ST. DAMIEN DE VEUSTER: Josef de Veuster received the name of Damien in the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary. When he was 23 years old, in 1863, he left Flanders, the land of his birth, to proclaim the Gospel on the other side of the world in the Hawaiian Islands. His missionary activity, which gave him such joy, reached its peak in charity. Not without fear and repugnance, he chose to go to the Island of Molokai to serve the lepers who lived there, abandoned by all. Thus he was exposed to the disease from which they suffered. He felt at home with them. The servant of the Word consequently became a suffering servant, a leper with the lepers, for the last four years of his life. In order to follow Christ, Fr. Damien not only left his homeland but also risked his health: therefore as the word of Jesus proclaimed ... says he received eternal life (*cf. Mark 10:30*) ... Following in St. Paul’s footsteps, St. Damien prompts us to choose the good warfare (*cf. 1 Timothy 1:18*), not the kind that brings division but the kind that gathers people together. He invites us to open our eyes to the forms of leprosy that disfigure the humanity of our brethren and still today call for the charity of our presence as servants, beyond that of our generosity. — *Benedict XVI*
