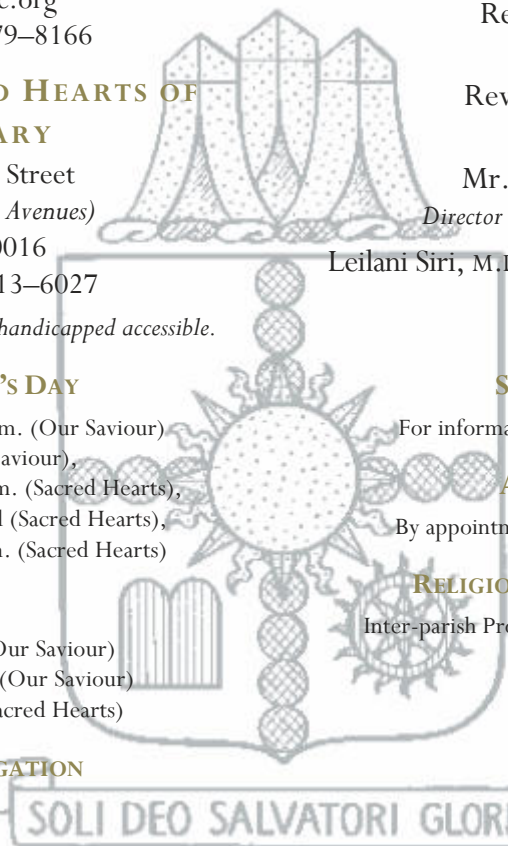

MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

The Eucharist is the food reserved for those who in Baptism were delivered from slavery and have become sons; it is the food that sustained them on the long journey of the exodus through the desert of human existence. Like the manna for the people of Israel, for every Christian generation the Eucharist is an indispensable nourishment that sustains them as they cross the desert of this world, parched by the ideological and economic systems that do not promote life but rather humiliate it. It is a world where the logic of power and possessions prevails rather than that of service and love; a world where the culture of violence and death is frequently triumphant. Yet Jesus comes to meet us and imbues us with certainty: he himself is “the Bread of life.” He repeated this to us in the words of the Gospel Acclamation: “I am the living bread from Heaven, if any one eats of this bread, he will live for ever.”

THE MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS

Heart of Jesus, formed by the Holy Spirit in the womb of the Virgin Mary, have mercy on us! So do we pray in the litany of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus.

This invocation refers directly to the mystery on which we meditate when we recite the Angelus: through the operation of the Holy Spirit the Humanity of Christ, Son of the Eternal Father, was formed in the womb of the Virgin of Nazareth.

Through operation of the Holy Spirit, the Heart was formed in this Humanity! The heart is the central organ of the human organism of Christ, it is at the same time the true symbol of his inner life, of his thought, his will, his sentiments. Through this Humanity, Christ’s Humanity is “God’s Temple” in a particular way and, at the same time, also through this Heart, it remains incessantly open to man and everything which is human: “Heart of Jesus, from whose fullness we have all received.”

SAINTS PETER AND PAUL, APOSTLES

I would like to pause on the Gospel passage (*cf. Matthew 16:13–19*) that the liturgy offers us on this Feast Day. It recounts a narrative that is fundamental to our journey of faith. It concerns the dialogue in which Jesus asks his disciples the question about his identity. He first asks them: “who do men say that the Son of man is?” (*v. 13*). And then he asks them directly: “who do you say that I am?” (*v. 15*). With these two questions, Jesus seems to say that it is one thing to follow the prevailing opinion, and another to encounter him and open oneself to his mystery: there one discovers the truth. Prevailing opinion contains a true but partial response; Peter, and with him the Church of the past, present and always, by the grace of God, responds with the truth: “You are the Christ, the Son of the living God” (*v. 16*).

Throughout the centuries, the world has defined Jesus in different ways: a great prophet of justice and love; a wise teacher of life; a revolutionary; a dreamer of God’s dreams ... and so on. Many beautiful things. In the confusion of these and other hypotheses, still today, a simple and clear one stands out, the confession of Simon, called Peter, a humble man full of faith: “You are the Christ, the Son of the living God” (*v. 16*). Jesus is the Son of God: hence he is perennially alive as his Father is eternally alive. This is the novelty that grace ignites in the heart of those who are open to the mystery of Jesus: the non-mathematical — but even stronger, inner — certainty of having encountered the Wellspring of Life, Life itself made flesh, visible and tangible in our midst. This is the experience of Christians, and it is not their merit, not that of we Christians; it is not our merit, but comes from God; it is a grace of God, the Father and Son and Holy Spirit. All this is contained in the seed of Peter’s response: “You are the Christ, the Son of the living God”.

Then, Jesus’ response is full of light: “you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the powers of death shall not prevail against it” (*v. 18*). It is the first time that Jesus says the word “Church”: and he does so expressing all his love for her, which he defines as “my Church”. It is the new community of the Covenant, no longer based on lineage and on the Law, but on faith in him, Jesus, the Face of God.
