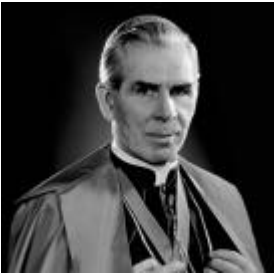

CANONIZATION OF JOHN HENRY NEWMAN



We rejoice in the news that Blessed John Henry Newman will be canonized by Pope Francis in Rome on Sunday, 13 October. John Henry Newman (1801–1890) was an English priest who converted to Catholicism and was the founder of the Oratory of St. Philip Neri in England. In 1879, Pope Leo XIII made Newman a Cardinal of the Holy Roman Church. Newman’s feast day is 9 October, the anniversary of his reception into the Catholic Church. The Church of Our Saviour is home to a shrine to Blessed John Henry Newman, which was dedicated shortly after his beatification in 2010.

ARCHBISHOP FULTON J. SHEEN



Last week, Pope Francis recognized a miracle through the intercession of Venerable Fulton J. Sheen (1895–1979). With this, we can reasonably expect that Archbishop Sheen will be beatified sometime soon.

Fulton John Sheen was born in El Paso, Illinois and ordained a priest for the Diocese of Peoria in 1919. He hosted a radio program, “The Catholic Hour” and a television series, “Life is Worth Living”, which reach an audience of 30 million viewers.

He was the National Director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, which was then headquartered at 109 East 38th Street (just alongside Our Saviour). Monsignor Hilary Franco served as an assistant to then-Bishop Sheen during this time. Archbishop Sheen served as an Auxiliary Bishop of New York for fifteen years, before serving as Bishop of Rochester for three years. Following his retirement as Bishop of Rochester, he was named a titular Archbishop and moved back to New York City. At the time of his death, he was interred in the crypt at St. Patrick’s Cathedral. Just a few weeks ago, his remains were transferred from St. Patrick’s to the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Peoria, where he was ordained a priest.

WHAT IS THE SAINTHOOD PROCESS?

The process of beatification and canonization in the Catholic Church is a lengthy and rigid procedure of documenting and examining the life, virtues and the writings of a holy man or woman. It begins at the level of the diocese where the candidate lived. At this stage, he or she is called the *Servant of God*. With the diocesan process over, the matter passes on to the Congregation for the Causes of the Saints in the Vatican, for further examination. When the heroic virtues of a person is recognized, he or she is called Venerable Servant of God, or simply *Venerable*. After this stage, a miracle through the intercession of the person is required to clear him or her for beatification, as is the case with Archbishop Sheen. A beatification ceremony is held where the person is declared a Blessed. Another such miracle is required after beatification to clear the person for *canonization*, declaring that person a saint.

THE GOOD SAMARITAN

He has made the poor, weak, and afflicted tokens and instruments of his presence; and here again, as is plain, the same temptation meets us to neglect or profane it. What he was, such are his chosen followers in the world; and as his obscure and defenseless state led men to insult and ill-treat him, so the like peculiarities, in the tokens of his presence, lead men to insult him now. That such are his tokens is plain from many passages of Scripture: for instance, he says of children, “Whoever receives one such little child in my name receives me.” Again: He said to Saul, who was persecuting his followers, “Why do you persecute me?” And he forewarns us, that at the Last Day he will say to the righteous, “I was hungry and you fed me; I was thirsty, and you gave me drink; I was a stranger, and you took me in; naked, and you clothed me; I was sick and you visited me; I was in prison and you came to me” And he adds, “Inasmuch as you have to it to the least of my brothers, you have done it to me”. He observes the same connection between himself and his followers in his words to the wicked. What makes this passage the more awful and apposite, is this, which has been before now remarked, that neither righteous nor wicked *knew* what they had done; even the righteous are represented as unaware that they had approached Christ. They say, “Lord, *when* did we see you hungry and fed you, thirsty and gave you drink?” In every age, then, Christ is both in the world, and yet not publicly so more than in the days of his flesh. — *From Blessed J.H. Newman, 25 December 1837*
