St. Jerome was a Church Father who centered his life on the Bible: he translated it into Latin, commented on it in his works, and above all, strove to live it in practice throughout his long earthly life, despite the well-known difficult, hot-tempered character with which nature had endowed him.

What can we learn from St. Jerome? It seems to me, this above all; to love the Word of God in Sacred Scripture. St. Jerome said: “Ignorance of the Scriptures is ignorance of Christ.” It is therefore important that every Christian live in constant and in personal dialogue with the Word of God given to us in Sacred Scripture. ... We must never forget that the Word of God transcends time. Human opinions come and go. What is very modern today will be very antiquated tomorrow. On the other hand, the Word of God is the Word of eternal life; it bears within it eternity and is valid forever. By carrying the Word of God within us, we therefore carry within us eternity, eternal life.

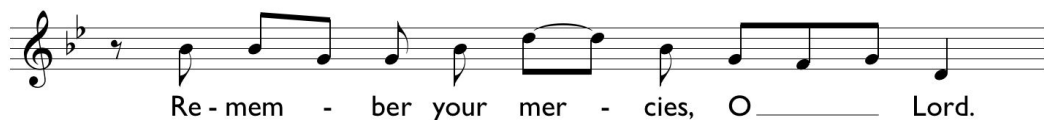
