We give thanks to almighty God for Pilar Maria, who was recently welcomed into the Church through the **Sacrament of Holy Baptism**. Please keep Pilar Maria, her parents, and her godparents, in your prayers.

Monday, 2 November is the **Feast of All Souls**. As you leave Mass, there are envelopes to be filled out enabling you to have your deceased loved ones remembered in our Masses for All Souls Day. Please return your enrollment envelope with the names of deceased family members, friends, neighbors, and co-workers to be remembered at Mass. They may be deposited in any of the offering boxes in the Church and Chapel.

On **All Souls Day**, Monday, 2 November, the 5:15 p.m. Mass at the Chapel will recognize healthcare workers who cared for COVID patients, many who died in their care, and their role in accompanying the dying given visitor restrictions. The Mass will be live-streamed via the parish's YouTube channel and is an effort to expand the Chapel's influence as a spiritual resource for healthcare providers and caregivers. All are welcome.

This Saturday, 31 October, the **beatification of Father Michael J. McGivney** will take place in Hartford. Born in 1852 in Waterbury, Connecticut, Father McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus in 1882. The KofC, now the largest lay Catholic organization in the world, sponsors educational, charitable, and religious activities. The miracle recognized by the Vatican occurred in 2015 and involved a baby, still in utero, with a life-threatening condition that could have led to an abortion. His parents, who live in Tennessee, prayed to Father McGivney to intercede with God to save their son, who was given no hope of surviving. Two miracles attributed to the candidate's intercession are required for sainthood – one for beatification and the second for canonization.

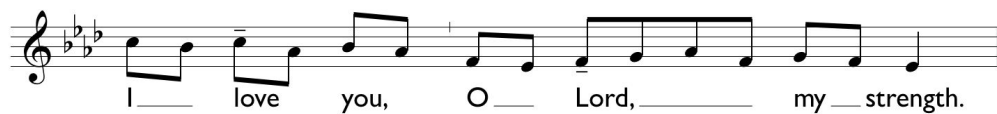
Praise the Lord, ye heav'ns adore him,
