On this last Sunday of the liturgical year, the Church celebrates the **Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe**. Pope Pius XI instituted this feast in 1925 to respond to growing secularism. He recognized that attempting to “thrust Jesus Christ and his holy law” out of public life would result in continuing discord among people and nations. Today reminds us that while governments come and go, Christ reigns as King forever. During the early twentieth century, in Mexico, Russia, and in many parts of Europe, atheistic regimes threatened not just the Catholic Church and its faithful but civilization itself. Pope Pius XI gave Catholics hope and—while governments around them crumbled—the assurance that Christ the King shall reign forever. In 2020, the Church faces pressures from both outside and within. Pope Pius XI reminds the faithful that Christ reigns as king of the entire world forever. Let us rededicate ourselves this year to acknowledging the reign of Jesus Christ and his Sacred Heart in every aspect of our lives.

Next Sunday, 29 November, is the **First Sunday of Advent**. For many families around the world, it is customary to have an Advent wreath in the home to mark the four Sundays of Advent. It's not too late: you can order an Advent wreath on Amazon! Next Sunday, we will bless the wreaths that are on display at the church and chapel which will help in our observance of the holy season of Advent.
