**Sunday of the Word of God:** In September 2019, Pope Francis established this Third Sunday in Ordinary Time as the “Sunday of the Word of God”. At that time, The Holy Father wrote: “The work of the Holy Spirit has to do not only with the formation of sacred Scripture; it is also operative in those who hear the word of God. The words of the Council Fathers are instructive: sacred Scripture is to be ‘read and interpreted in the light of the same Spirit through whom it was written’ (*Dei Verbum*, 12). God’s revelation attains its completion and fullness in Jesus Christ; nonetheless, the Holy Spirit does not cease to act. It would be reductive indeed to restrict the working of the Spirit to the divine inspiration of sacred Scripture and its various human authors. We need to have confidence in the working of the Holy Spirit as he continues in his own way to provide ‘inspiration’ whenever the Church teaches the sacred Scriptures, whenever the Magisterium authentically interprets them (cf. *ibid.*, 10), and whenever each believer makes them the norm of his or her spiritual life. In this sense, we can understand the words spoken by Jesus to his disciples when they told him that they now understood the meaning of his parables: ‘Every scribe who has been trained for the kingdom of heaven is like a householder who brings out of his treasure what is new and what is old’ (*Matthew 13:52*).

“May the Sunday of the Word of God help his people to grow in religious and intimate familiarity with the sacred Scriptures. For as the sacred author taught of old: “This word is very near to you: it is in your mouth and in your heart for your observance” (*Deuteronomy 30:14*).”




