**Reflection for Easter Sunday:** More than in other years, we feel we need an announcement that, when confronted with death, tells us that death is not the last goal of existence. Indeed, the resurrection of the Crucifix has a meaning and a strength that are valid for all humanity and for the entire cosmos; it is like a seed thrown into the darkness of the earth, which mysteriously grows and bears fruit. With the Risen One a great historical battle began between life and death, between hope and despair, between resignation to the worst and the struggle for the best, a battle that will have no respite until the definitive defeat of all the powers of hatred and of destruction.

And we are Christians because we believe that Jesus has risen from the dead, is alive, is among us, is present in history, is the source of new life, the first fruit of our participation in the divine nature and, therefore, the guarantor of human dignity in every occasion and against all evidence of evil.

St Gregory of Nissa rightly stated in an Easter homily: “Another generation has appeared, another life, another way of living, a change in our very nature”.

Let this Easter 2021 be for us a new exodus. May our Parish community flourish, allow itself to be surprised, amazed, enthusiastic with vibrant hope! The Risen One is present in our life every time we repeat his gestures, his words, his actions; every time we live the beatitudes. The Risen One is present in every Eucharist and in all the Sacraments. May we become a sign of the Resurrection by living as brothers and sisters, bringing hope to those in despair, joy to those who are afflicted, and peace to those who are troubled. May the Hallelujah of this day help us rise and reach out to those who are suffering, the sick, the poor, the homeless, the marginalized, the refugees and all those who await gestures of love. For all Jesus died on the cross, for all He rose from the dead and the Father wants to give life without end to all.
