Sponsor Card: will be provided for registered parishioners who attend Mass on a regular basis - ONLY.

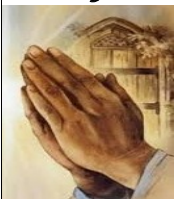
Please remember to follow CDC guidelines to wear a mask at all times if you are not vaccinated.

GUIDELINES FOR PUBLIC MASSES

- ◆ Those vaccinated are not required to wear masks. You may decide for yourself.
- ◆ Those who are not fully vaccinated must wear a mask.
- ◆ Ministers must wear masks for distributing Holy communion.
- ◆ The Sign of Peace is to be celebrated without physical contact between non-family members.
- ◆ Full choirs and congregational singing are not yet able to resume.
- ◆ We'll continue to use stationary collection boxes.
- ◆ When seating ourselves, we should continue to distance ourselves at least three feet from strangers and also keep this distance while in line for Holy Communion.

We have opened the Church of Saint Cecilia for the 8:00 am Mass as of June 6th. Also, the Chapel of Saint Anthony will become the confessional room for the Sacrament of Confession every Saturday from 3:00 pm until 3:30 pm. The lighting of candles can happen after this time or after Mass.

Stories for All Seasons

Thirteenth Sunday: Jairus's Daughter

Theme: Jesus wants us to respond in faith to life's problems

John Killinger tells a moving story about a couple whose newborn son was mentally retarded. They were crushed, of course. Still they loved him as they would any child of theirs. They built a bedroom with glass walls so that wherever they were in the house they would be able to keep an eye on him. For seventeen years, the mother slept next to the boy with her hand next to his heart. If he ever started having trouble breathing, she would be able to wake up and give him artificial respiration. For seventeen years, they lived this way.

One sad day, however, a neighbor's girl fell from a tree and hurt her arm. The mother left her son to rush the girl to a hospital. As she was standing in the emergency room of the hospital with the little girl, her husband came in carrying the body of their son. He had died while she was at the hospital. His father had tried vainly to revive him. As the boy lay before them in peace, the parents wept. But then they gave thanks to God for the gift of their son. "For," his mother said, "he taught us how to love."

Application: Learning to love is the greatest healing that faith can bring about. Have we been healed in this way?
