From the Pastor:

There is a lot in the news about the synod in Rome on the family currently going on. Perhaps the best guide is Pope Francis, in his opening homily. He said:

"The Church is called to carry out her mission in fidelity, truth and love. To carry out her mission in fidelity to her Master as a voice crying out in the desert, in defending faithful love and encouraging the many families which live married life as an experience which reveals of God's love; in defending the sacredness of life, of every life; in defending the unity and indissolubility of the conjugal bond as a sign of God's grace and of the human person's ability to love seriously.

The Church is called to carry out her mission in truth, which is not changed by passing fads or popular opinions. The truth which protects individuals and humanity as a whole from the temptation of self-centredness and from turning fruitful love into sterile selfishness, faithful union into temporary bonds. "Without truth, charity degenerates into sentimentality. Love becomes an empty shell, to be filled in an arbitrary way. In a culture without truth, this is the fatal risk facing love" (Benedict XVI, Caritas in Veritate, 3).

And the Church is called to carry out her mission in charity, not pointing a finger in judgment of others, but faithful to her nature as a mother - conscious of her duty to seek out and care for hurting couples with the balm of acceptance and mercy; to be a "field hospital" with doors wide open to whoever knocks in search of help and support; even more, to reach out to others with true love, to walk with our fellow men and women who suffer, to include them and guide them to the wellspring of salvation.

A Church which teaches and defends fundamental values, while not forgetting that "the Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath" (Mk 2:27); and that Jesus also said: "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick; I came not to call the righteous, but sinners" (Mk 2:17). A Church which teaches authentic love, which is capable of taking loneliness away, without neglecting her mission to be a good Samaritan to wounded humanity.

In this spirit we ask the Lord to accompany us during the Synod and to guide his Church, through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Saint Joseph, her most chaste spouse.

Let us pray for our own archbishop, Cardinal Dolan, who is at the synod, for all bishops, and the Holy Father. And let's pray for all families of our parish!


Guidelines for Reserving Masses

It is a tremendous blessing and joy that the parish community of OLSH continues to grow and thrive, with over 1400 families currently registered . However, with only four Masses each weekend (Sat. evening and Sunday morning) and three additional on the teaching Mass weekends, for a total of 55 announced Masses, it has become increasingly difficult for parishioners to remember their loved ones with a Mass on a date that is especially meaningful. This is even more challenging for those whose personal or professional responsibilities make it impossible for them to attend a weekday Mass.

In the Christian spirit of loving and helping each other, we are introducing the following to try to address these concerns:

- 1. With the agreement of both persons who are requesting a Mass, the Mass can be offered for TWO intentions. When you come to the rectory to request a Mass you will be asked if you would agree to sharing that Mass with someone else for whom that day is significant. If you do, a note will be made in the Mass book. The Mass is a most powerful prayer and God will bless your kindness, understanding and generosity of spirit.
- 2. During the first week the Mass book is open, M- F, an individual or household may reserve up to three **weekend** Masses. There is no limit on the number of reservations for weekday Masses, including Saturday at 9 AM.
- 3. To provide the opportunity to reserve Masses for those who are unable to come to the rectory during regular business hours, M-F, 9-3, the rectory will be open from 6-7 PM on Mon. Oct. 26 and Tues. Oct. 27.
- 4. As always, you may call the rectory (359-1230) during business hours to reserve a Mass and then follow up with your donation. Please remember, however, that when the Mass book first opens there may be significant wait time as the secretary attends to those in the office.
