**“Brothers and sisters: Every priest stands daily at his ministry, offering frequently those same sacrifices that can never take away sins. But this one offered one sacrifice for sins, and took His seat forever at the right hand of God. Where there is forgiveness of these, there is no longer offering for sin.”**

### PARISH MINISTRIES


Greatly **needed** are parishioners who would be interested in joining one of our ministries in the Parish – either at St. Mary's or Our Lady of Mercy Churches.:
