AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM THE CARDINAL

Each year the Cardinal's Stewardship Appeal is conducted in every parish in the Archdiocese of NY. This year the Cardinal has asked us to reassure parishioners that **any money contributed toward the appeal will definitely not be used for settlements from sexual abuse complaints about our priests.**

As many families do when they are faced with large unexpected expenses, the Archdiocese has borrowed for purposes of justice and healing up to \$100 million, which will be paid back from non-parish originated funds. Cardinal Dolan has emphasized once again **that no funds received in collections or appeals will be used to settle complaints.**

TODAY'S GOSPEL MESSAGE by
Rev. William J. Reilly

"Brothers and sisters: If then you were raised with Christ, seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Think of what is above, not of what is on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ your life appears, then you too will appear with him in glory."

The day of victory and triumph, bringing great joy and peace. We have visited the empty tomb, and ask with the anxious apostles, 'where is He?'. 'We were hoping...' As Easter people our hopes are not dashed, but we hear reports of the Risen Christ in the upper room, on the road to Emmaus, in the garden and at the shores of the sea. He is not hidden.

We as believers look for the Lord too. Look within, as He lives and lives in us. Today may we recognize His presence through the life of grace. May we acknowledge in His presence in others. May we bring that presence to those who are slow to believe. May we adore that presence in the Eucharist. Don't let His life remain hidden, but through living your faith reveal that presence to others.

OUR CEMETERY

We have noticed that some of the monuments in the cemetery have been disturbed. Because of the age of these stones, we believe the problems are weather and age related.

We are asking that you check your family's gravesites especially in the old sections. Also, if anyone knows of or has seen any damage done by vandalism, please call the rectory office. We remind owners of monuments that any damage not caused by cemetery personnel is the responsibility of the monument owner.

Cemetery personnel is in the process of doing their spring cleanup which will also include (within the next few weeks) a spraying of weed killer. Please do not plant fresh flowers or shrubs until this is done. We try not to get the spray on the flowers but sometimes it cannot be helped.

We remind you that cemetery rules and regulations request you do not leave little objects on or around the monuments. We have noticed little toys, memorabilia, decorative flags stuck in the ground, small statues, etc. We ask you to please remove these because they can be an impediment when mowing or caring for the property. If items are not removed, our personnel will remove them and place them in a box for you to pick up.

If you would like a copy of the cemetery rules and regulations, please call the rectory office and we will be more than glad to provide a copy to you.
