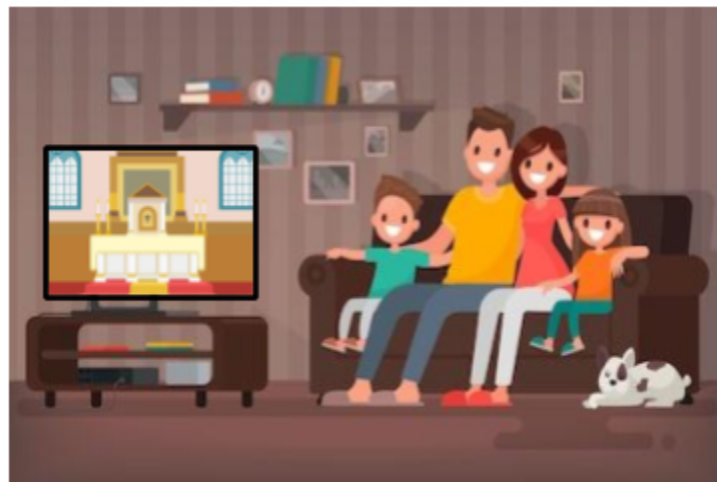
Our Bishop has made the incredibly difficult decision to suspend public masses in our diocese to protect the most vulnerable from the spread of COVID-19. It is an incredible act of solidarity for all of us to sacrifice receiving Christ in the Eucharist in order to protect and defend the life of those whose health could be jeopardized if we gather together. Encourage your family to treat this as a true mass
— keep electronics in another room, put food and drinks away, etc.

Get ready for mass! It's tempting to stay in pajamas, but getting dressed can help us get in the right mindset to take the mass seriously.

Stand, sit, and kneel as you would if you were at mass. We might be separated by a screen, but our Lord is still present in the mass that we are watching.



TIPS FOR WATCHING MASS AT HOME!

Respond to the prayers as you would at a regular Mass! This is going to feel strange, but when the priest says, "Peace be with you," respond and participate in the mass saying, "And with your spirit."

Consider opening a Bible and following along with the readings (it might help to mark them ahead of time).

Consider moving chairs into the room where you'll watch mass. Even if that's the living room - consider sitting on regular chairs instead of the sofa.

There are still ways that we can join in. Although we are *temporarily* dispensed from our Sunday obligation during this time, there are many ways to stream masses from within our diocese and from around the nation (and even the world!). It can be difficult - and sometimes can feel awkward - to know how to participate in a virtual mass, so we've included some tips and tricks to guide you through this experience. This is not going to be the same as being surrounded by our regular community of parishioners, but we can take comfort in the words of Christ, "For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them" (Matthew 18:20).

When all this is over..

When our parishes begin having public masses again, [run as fast as you can to the Eucharist](#) - because although it's nice to be able to still hear the readings and the homily during this time, there's nothing that can replace the experience of actually receiving Jesus' Body and Blood in the Mass!
