Seton Catholic Fans,

This fall sports season presents some very unique challenges. One of the most difficult challenges is how to manage spectators at events. We recently met with a representative from the Wayne County Health Department and went over a plan to allow spectators at our home athletic events. The representative stressed that, due to contact tracing, we need to know where fans are sitting at each game. This was necessary to allow as many parents and family members see their children play as possible. Again, we know this isn't ideal, but we are doing this for the athletes and their families.

For soccer events, we will be implementing the following plan:

- Per the Governor's mandate and the IHSAA's directive, masks will be required for all spectators.
- We will be limited to 250 total spectators.
 - Spectators will need to bring their own chairs to sit in during games.
 - We will **NOT** have bleachers for fans in an order to create more fan seating and appropriately socially distance.
 - Spectators will sit in "family groups" that will be painted in the grass.
 - Seton Catholic fans will sit in the family group boxes across from the home bench.
 - Visiting fans will sit in the family group boxes across from the visiting bench.
- Since we do not anticipate reaching maximum capacity, we will be selling paper tickets at the gate.

We do NOT have the capability to live-stream our soccer games at this time.

Again, we know some of these protocols are not ideal, but they are what is necessary to create a safe environment to allow our student-athletes to compete at this time. They also allow the student-athletes' parents and family members to watch them play. We sincerely appreciate your cooperation and we anxiously anticipate the day when we can return to normal.
