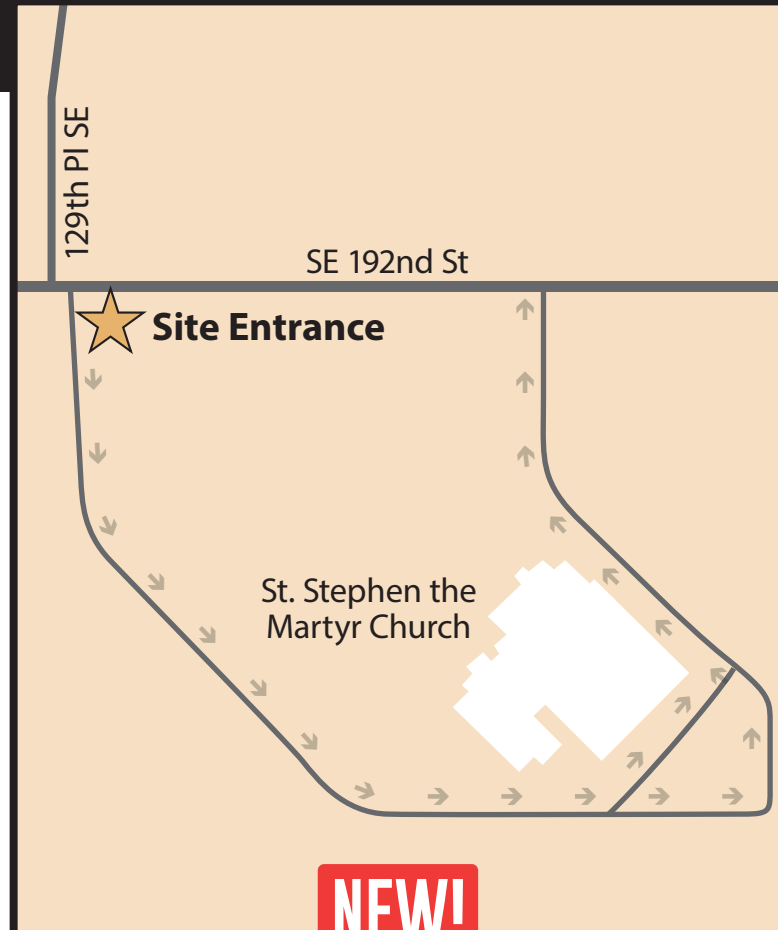

## Ongoing Recycling Options

Item	Accepted	NOT Accepted	Notes	Ongoing Recycling Options
<b>Bulky Wood Waste</b>	Stumps, logs, and limbs at least 4 inches in diameter; pallets and clean, unpainted, untreated wood and plywood.	No tree debris less than 4 inches in diameter or larger than 3 feet in diameter. No twigs, small branches, brush, leaves, grass clippings, sod, soil, or painted, stained or treated wood, particle board, or sheet rock.	Please lay a tarp under wood debris for easy removal. Nails do not need to be removed.	Search <a href="http://kingcounty.gov/whatdoldowith">kingcounty.gov/whatdoldowith</a> for local "Yard Waste" recyclers
<b>Cardboard</b>	Clean, dry, flattened cardboard.	No wax coated cardboard. No wet or excessively dirty cardboard. No strapping, packing materials or garbage.	Please flatten cardboard.	<b>Renton Recycling and Transfer Station</b> , 3021 NE 4th St, Renton, 206-477-4466 or search <a href="http://kingcounty.gov/whatdoldowith">kingcounty.gov/whatdoldowith</a> for local "Paper" recyclers
<b>Confidential Material Shredding</b>	Confidential paper materials for secure shredding and recycling. Limit 5 file-sized boxes per vehicle that are approximately 11 x 11 x 17.5 inches. Use these dimensions as a guideline.	No: X-rays, photos, binders, CDs/DVDs, newspapers, magazines, plastic coverings or bags. Limit 5 file-size boxes (11 x 11 x 17.5 inches). No exceptions.	The following can be shredded with the paper and do <b>not</b> need to be removed: paper clips, staples, binder clips, rubber bands, window envelopes, manila folders.	<b>Free Community Shred Events:</b> <a href="http://atg.wa.gov/shredathon.aspx">atg.wa.gov/shredathon.aspx</a> , 206-477-4466
<b>Broken Concrete, Asphalt, Rock, Brick, Toilets &amp; Sinks</b>	Rock, brick, broken concrete, asphalt pavement, cinder blocks, toilets and sinks.	No sand, asphalt shingles, gravel, crushed rock, and similar landscaping materials. Concrete mix material must be removed from bags.	<b>Fee:</b> \$15 per unit for each sink or toilet, CASH ONLY. Please lay a tarp under concrete, rock, asphalt and bricks for easy removal. Rocks and smaller concrete pieces <b>must</b> be in boxes or five-gallon buckets for easy removal. Plastic, metal and wood must be removed.	Search <a href="http://kingcounty.gov/whatdoldowith">kingcounty.gov/whatdoldowith</a> for local "Construction and Demolition Debris" recyclers
<b>Electronic Equipment</b>	Cell phones, printers, keyboards, mice, fax machines, photo-copiers, scanners, stereos VCRs and DVD players.	No commercial equipment.	Remove all personal information from cell phones. Equipment can be working or non-working.	Search <a href="http://kingcounty.gov/whatdoldowith">kingcounty.gov/whatdoldowith</a> for local "Electronics" recyclers
<b>Household Items</b>	Clothing, shoes, purses, bedding, linens, fabrics, books, games, toys, kitchenware, housewares, small garden equipment, and hand tools.	No carpeting, furniture, work-stations, garden hoses, any wet, torn, soiled, broken, damaged or incomplete items.	Must be clean and in good operating condition for resale by a charity. Vendor reserves the right to refuse any item it cannot use.	<b>Donate</b> to local charity or second hand store.
<b>Mattresses</b>	Mattresses and box springs, any size.	No commercial loads. No furniture or frames. No wet or soiled items. No futons.	<b>Fee:</b> \$15 per mattress, \$15 per box spring. <b>CASH ONLY.</b> Items must be dry and clean. <b>Limit:</b> 6 mattresses or box springs (combined total no more than 6). Vendor reserves the right to refuse any item it cannot recycle.	Search <a href="http://kingcounty.gov/whatdoldowith">kingcounty.gov/whatdoldowith</a> for local "Furniture" recyclers
<b>Refrigerators, Freezers, and Household Air Conditioners</b>	Household refrigerators and freezers less than 4-by-6 foot, and household air conditioners.	No commercial appliances or automobile air conditioning units.	<b>Fee:</b> \$30 per unit, <b>CASH ONLY.</b> Other appliances accepted for free as scrap metal (see below).	Search <a href="http://kingcounty.gov/whatdoldowith">kingcounty.gov/whatdoldowith</a> for local "Appliance" recyclers
<b>Scrap Metal</b>	Auto parts, engines and gas mowers (drained of oil and gas), metal lawn chairs, stoves, micro-waves, hot water tanks, washers, dryers, cast iron sinks and tubs, swing sets, BBQ's, iron, steel, and other similar metals.	No car bodies, trailers, fluorescent light ballasts or items containing fluids.	Please remove any fluids, rubber, plastic, vinyl, webbing, and wheels.	Search <a href="http://kingcounty.gov/whatdoldowith">kingcounty.gov/whatdoldowith</a> for local "Metal" recyclers
<b>Polystyrene Blocks and Packing Peanuts</b>	Blocks: Expanded polystyrene only. Look for the #6 or EPS inside the recycling symbol. Blocks and Packing peanuts: must be clean, dry and contained in bags or boxes. No tape or labels.	No urethane foam cushions, hot tub covers, expanded polypropylene or foam insulation.	<b>Blocks:</b> Expanded polystyrene only. Look for the ♻️ or ♻️ inside the recycling symbol. <b>Packing peanuts:</b> Please keep separate from blocks in a box or bag. <b>All materials must be clean and dry.</b>	Search <a href="http://kingcounty.gov/whatdoldowith">kingcounty.gov/whatdoldowith</a> for local "Plastic" recyclers
<b>Tires</b>	Light truck, car, motorcycle, and bike tires, including bias, steel belted, and studded tires.	No oversized tires accepted (for example, tractor or backhoe tires).	<b>Fees:</b> Small tires (18.5 inches or less in diameter): off rim \$1.50 each, on rim \$3.00 each. Large tires (more than 18.5 inches in diameter, but smaller than oversized): off rim \$3.50 each, on rim \$7.00 each. <b>Limit:</b> Up to 10 tires total per vehicle. <b>CASH ONLY.</b> No oversized tires accepted (for example, tractor or backhoe tires). 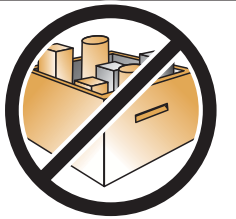
## Event Restrictions and Recommendations

- This event is open to Fairwood and King County **households only**.
- Businesses or commercial loads will **NOT** be accepted. Businesses can visit [www.kingcounty.gov/WhatDoIDoWith](http://www.kingcounty.gov/WhatDoIDoWith) for information on recycling options. We reserve the right to refuse oversized loads or loads that appear to be commercial.
- Cars, passenger vans and pick-ups only. Utility trailers up to 10 feet long may be used to haul items to the event.
- Service providers have no obligation to collect any hazardous or other materials that do not conform to the specific descriptions and restrictions listed in this brochure.

## Please DON'T Bring

### These household wastes

- No garbage or trash
- No window glass
- No broken or soiled items
- No paint of any kind\*

### These hazardous wastes

- No propane tanks
- No oil-based paints / thinners / solvents
- No pesticides
- No cleaning products
- No antifreeze, oil or other automotive products
- No aerosol cans
- No batteries

Most of these hazardous wastes can be taken to the Household Hazardous Wastemobile or one of four household hazardous waste collection sites, including the Auburn Supermall (northwest corner of mall at 101 SuperMall Way).
