**BLESSING OF CARS, VANS, SUVs, 4x4s, TRUCKS,

Each year on the 20<sup>th</sup> of July, we celebrate the Feast of St. Elias (prophet Elijah) who lived in Palestine in the 9<sup>th</sup> century before Christ. We read about his life and miracles in the Scriptures in 1 Kings 17 to 2 Kings 2. There the story is told that he was carried up to heaven in a fiery chariot. For this reason, he has become the Patron of drivers and the Protector of various means of transportation.

On St. Elias's feast or on the weekend nearest his feast, it is the practice in some parishes to bless cars with Holy Water after Mass.

**HIPAA & YOUR SICK FAMILY MEMBER  
PLEASE INFORM US IF YOUR FAMILY MEMBER IS  
SICK &/OR HOSPITALIZED.**

The Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 [HIPAA] does many good things. At the same time, it creates a difficulty for us as a church. Information about your sick relative cannot be released to anyone. Therefore, priests, deacons, and Eucharistic ministers can no longer access names of St. Bon's parishioners in the hospital's Pastoral Care Department. The ONLY WAY for us to know that your loved one is in the hospital, rehab center, nursing home, hospice, or wherever, is through A PHONE CALL FROM YOU informing us of your family member's condition and whereabouts.

Recently I have been greatly saddened to find out at wakes and funerals that a parishioner had been in a nursing home for months and "nobody from the church came to visit our sick mother, father, brother, or sister." But we could not respond because we didn't know!

Ministry to the Sick of our parish is a priority. Of course, we want to bring the Eucharist and celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Please don't hesitate to call the parish office [973.279.1016] to inform us of your relative's condition and location. We will gladly visit and try to bring some comfort and healing.

**FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

**First Reading: Ezekiel 2:2-5**

Ezekiel is moved to respond to the call of God and to accentuate his teaching with a direct reference to the Word of God.

**Second Reading: II Corinthians 12:7-10**

Paul had questioned the value of his suffering, and God replied, "My grace is enough for you, for strength is made perfect in weakness." Paul then realized that although he was weak against persecution, he was strong in faith.

**Gospel: Mark 6:1-6a**

Jesus could do little for those in his own part of the country, for their lack of faith in him was so great. Therefore, he spent much of his time teaching in neighboring villages instead.

**FEEDING THE POOR AND HUNGRY**

Our St. Bonaventure community generously supported the food collection for the Father English Center on Saturday, June 23rd. Contributions included:

23 frozen dinners                      200 lbs. of rice  
26 bags of groceries  
15 bags of used clothing  
11 cartons of canned goods    \$150 in donations

These totals include a \$150 donation to the NJ Food Bank for the account of the Fr. English Food Pantry made by our Knights of Columbus Council #240, as well as 2 frozen dinners, 4 bags of groceries and a bag of used clothing donated by residents of Mountain Ridge Towers in Woodland Park.

While most of us look forward to vacations and outdoor activities in the summer, there are many in our community who are not as fortunate. With the closing of schools and associated lunch programs, poor parents are in greater need of food at this time.
