### BLESSING OF CARS, VANS, SUVs, 4x4s, TRUCKS, MOTORCYCLES, CHARIOTS.... on the weekend of July 21<sup>ST</sup> and 22<sup>ND</sup>

Each year on the 20<sup>th</sup> of July, we celebrate the Feast of St. Elias (prophet Elijah) who lived in Palestine in the 9<sup>th</sup> century before Christ. We read about his life and miracles in the Scriptures in 1 Kings 17 to 2 Kings 2. There the story is told that he was carried up to heaven in a fiery chariot. For this reason, he has become the Patron of drivers and the Protector of various means of transportation.

On St. Elias's feast or on the weekend nearest his feast, it is the practice in some parishes to bless cars with Holy Water after Mass.

From the pastor's desk ...

Thank you! Thank you! Thank you to all who participated in last Sunday's celebration of the Feast Day of our patron Saint Bonaventure as well as the 140<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the dedication of our cherished church! We carry on in the long tradition of good worship, good food, and good fun! Thank you to all who set up the church yard and moved tables and chairs, all who prepared the food and drink, and all who remained to clean up afterwards. We pray that we have at least another one-hundred forty years at St. Bon's!

Remember I mentioned that St. Bonaventure often preached on the CRIB and the CROSS. This weekend at all the Masses we will acknowledge the presence of a relic that will remain with us for the rest of the summer. It is a piece of marble from a church that was destroyed in Aleppo, Syria. It was brought to the United States by our Franciscan Minister General, Father Michael Perry, O.F.M., a native of Chicago who is now serving in Rome as the head of the Order of Friars Minor. Fr. Michael has asked that this relic be put in a place of honor in our provincial sanctuaries to remind us all to pray each day for the refugees of Syria and other war-torn areas and displaced people of the world.

Each month the relic will be moved to another Franciscan ministry. We will have this relic until September. May it unite us to the church in Syria and its many suffering people. May we pray in solidarity with them and for the peace of the whole world.

SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Jeremiah 23:1-6

In this passage, God denounces false leaders who have scattered his people. He promises that they will be reunited and led by one who is just and wise.

Second Reading: Ephesians 2:13-18

Paul explains that through Jesus Christ, there is no longer hostility between Gentile and Jew. Instead, through the Spirit of Christ, both groups become one body and are equal in the eyes of God.

Gospel: Mark 6:30-34

The apostles returned after their first mission and told Jesus what they had done and taught. He told them to rest, but the people kept coming to them. So they went to find a private place, but the people learned where they were going and arrived first. Jesus felt sorry for them and decided to teach them instead of resting.
