FEEDING THE POOR AND HUNGRY

Once again, our St. Bonaventure's community generously supported the Father English Center food collection on Saturday, December 15 by contributing:

25 frozen dinners 50 lbs. frozen chicken breasts
22 bags of groceries 8 frozen turkeys
14 cartons of canned goods 1 frozen turkey breast
200 lbs. of rice 36 bags of used clothing
\$400 in donations

These totals include a \$300 donation to the Community Food Bank of New Jersey for the account of the Fr. English Food Pantry made by our Knights of Columbus Council #240 as well as a \$100 donation to the same account made by a generous parishioner. Food totals also include 3 frozen dinners, 6 bags of groceries and a frozen turkey donated by residents of Mountain Ridge Towers in Woodland Park.

As we anticipate this month's collection, please reflect on the story of the ancient mystic who told of a man who, while walking one day past a beggar on the street asked, "Why, God, do you not do something for these people?" God replied, "I did do something, I made you." There are still beggars among us! You will see them in the line every morning in front of the Fr. English Food Pantry. It is God who calls us to feed them!

As we reflect on the spiritual implications of this Christmas season, know that God will bless us for our generosity to the marginalized in our society. And as we start the New Year, let us resolve to enthusiastically continue to remember the hungry in our midst and prepare for our next collection of groceries and frozen dinners on Saturday January 19.

***HIPAA & YOUR SICK FAMILY MEMBER
PLEASE INFORM US IF YOUR FAMILY
MEMBER IS SICK &/OR HOSPITALIZED.***

The Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 [HIPAA] does many good things. At the same time, it creates a difficulty for us as a church. Information about your sick relative cannot be released to anyone. Therefore, priests, deacons, and Eucharistic ministers can no longer access names of St. Bon's parishioners in the hospital's Pastoral Care Department. The ONLY WAY for us to know that your loved one is in the hospital, rehab center, nursing home, hospice, or wherever, is through A PHONE CALL FROM YOU informing us of your family member's condition and whereabouts.

In the past, I have been greatly saddened to find out at wakes and funerals that a parishioner had been in a nursing home for months and "nobody from the church came to visit our sick mother, father, brother, or sister." But we could not respond because we didn't know!

Ministry to the Sick of our parish is a priority. Of course, we want to bring the Eucharist and celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Please don't hesitate to call the parish office [973.279.1016] to inform us of your relative's condition and location. We will gladly visit and try to bring some comfort and healing.
